by the States of New York and New Jersey in recognition of Mann Ki Baat.







US Commerce Secretary Recounts her Meeting with PM Modi

ccording to US Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo, who recently met with Prime Minister Ňarendra Modi, India and America will lead the artificial intelligence revolution. Raimondo, who visited India in March, said she saw the finest of India in terms of culture, tradition, and celebrations.

Addressing a gathering of Indian Americans at the India House, the commerce secretary fondly remembered her Holi celebrations this year in India.

"I was recently in India. I went a day earlier so that I could have the opportunity to participate in Holi.

And the defence minister was so gracious to host me with his family," Raimondo said.

"I had an incredible opportunity to spend an hour and a half with Prime Minister Modi. He is the most popular world leader for a reason. He is unbelievable, visionary, and his level of commitment to the people of India is just indescribable," she said.

Earlier this year, India and the United States established collaborations in space, defense, semiconductors, and generation technology.



Democratic National Convention Comes to Chicago

he 2024 Democratic National Convention will take place in Chicago, Illinois, according to the US Democratic National Committee (DNC).

The event will take place in the United Center from August 19 to 22

of the next year, during which the Democratic Party's delegates will formally nominate their presidential candidate.

The 2024 Republican National Convention will take place in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, from July 15 to

July 18.

Joe Biden, the President, stated on April 10 that he intends to run for reelection in 2024 but that his team is not yet ready to make the announcement.

Joe Biden Administration: Expanding Healthcare for DACA Recipients

Immigrants who were brought to the United States as youngsters will be able to qualify for federal health insurance programs. President Joe Biden's administration has announced, in a move that was welcomed as "long overdue".

statement, the Biden administration said people enrolled in the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) programme would be able to apply for Medicaid, a health insurance programme for low-income earners in the US.

DACA recipients, also referred to as "Dreamers," would be able to access other services under the Affordable Care Act, as well.

"They're American in every way except for on paper," Biden said in a video shared on Twitter. "We need to give Dreamers the opportunities and support they deserve."

While Congress has failed to act,

the Biden-Harris Administration has taken significant measures to protect Dreamers," the White House said in a fact sheet, including fighting legal challenges that "attempt to strip them of the only home they have ever known".

Approximately 580,000 people are presently registered in DACA, which was established in 2012 by former President Barack Obama to allow individuals to live and work in the United States without fear of deportation.

The Department of Health and Human Services will seek to change that regulation by the end of the month, The Associated Press news agency reported.

commend the Biden administration for moving to rectify this years-long injustice so that more DACA recipients can access the care they need," said Kica Matos, Executive

Vice President of programmes and strategy at the National Immigration Law Center.

"This move comes as many DACA recipients experience harmful mental and physical health effects from living through continuous, politically motivated attacks on the program," Matos said in a statement.

Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal wrote on *Twitter* that the move marked "a long overdue step toward justice". "Health care is a human right, and DACA recipients deserve access to that care just like everyone else," she said.

"Millions of Dreamers have called our country home since they were too young to remember anywhere else. They deserve EVERY opportunity to succeed and live a healthy life here in America," US Senator Tina Smith also tweeted.

Indian Ambassador to the USA Taranjit Singh Sandhu Addresses New Hampshire House

aranjit Singh Sandhu addressedtheNewHampshire House of Representatives on April 6. He praised the House as a "temple of democracy" and said in his visit, he's been very impressed by the vibrant and growing

Indian-American community in New Hampshire.

"We feel very proud of them, that as professionals, as public servants, and as experts in different emerging technologies, they are an important part of New Hampshire," Sandhu said. The ambassador told the House that he believes the US-India relationship would be one of the most important on the national stage through the rest of this century.



US-India Relations to Strengthen: Biden Announces Trip to India in 2023

S President Joe Biden is looking forward to visiting India in September, according to his administration's point person for South and Central Asia, noting that 2023 will be a "big year" for the India-US relationship.

"This is gonna be a big year. Of course, India is hosting the G20. This year, the United States is hosting APEC. Japan is hosting the G7. We have lots of our QUAD members who are taking on leadership roles. And it provides opportunities for all of us to bring our countries closer together," Assistant Secretary of State for South and Central Asia, Donald Lu, told news agency *PTI* in an interview.

"I know our president is looking forward to travelling to India in September. That will be his first trip to India as part of the G-20 Leaders Summit. We are really excited about what is to come in the next few months," he said.

"We're only a little over three months into this new year. And we have had a number of really exciting things that happened," he said.

"In March Dr. Jaishankar hosted his QUAD counterparts for a ministerial meeting and extraordinary public events at the Raisina Dialogue with all four foreign ministers together. It was the first such public discussion with QUAD foreign ministers and really drove home how our four countries are coming together to support the people of the Indo-Pacific," he said.

"And then lastly, this month, the arrival of our new Ambassador Eric Garcetti. He has already received a



really warm welcome from our Indian and American staff at the US Embassy. Once he presents his credentials, he is looking forward to meeting with the rest of India and I think India will find that he is young, he is enthusiastic, and he's eager to bring our relations to new heights," Lu said.

"We are really thankful for the tremendous work India has done by hosting the G20 Foreign Ministerial meeting last month, and we look forward to actively participating in the many future G20 meetings coming up this year, including the New Delhi Leaders Summit in September," he said.

"We have seen how the G20 brings together countries for collective action. This meeting in March was no exception. As India has already shown during the first few meetings of its presidency, the Gww20 is a powerful forum where the world's leading economies can come together to respond to global challenges: food security, health, energy insecurity, climate change and unsustainable debt," he said.

Udai Tambar on Racial Justice Advisory Board in US

dai Tambar, the CEO and President of New York Junior Tennis and Learning (NYJTL), has been selected to the advisory board on the implementation of the Racial Justice Charter Amendments, which Mayor Eric Adams and Mayor's Office of Equity Commissioner Sideya Sherman launched last week.

"I am excited to partner with the new Advisory Board to represent NYC's most resilient communities," Tambar was quoted as saying in the statement. "A majority of the families we serve at NYJTL are BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Colour) New Yorkers, and it is crucial that this new racial equity infrastructure ensures that they live in a society where they can flourish and achieve their fullest potential," he added.

"These added a statement of values to the city's charter; required the city to establish a racial equity office and commission, as well as racial equityfocused plans; and called for the city to measure the true cost of living for city residents," the statement said.



NITI Aayog Vice Chair Discusses India's Economy at Indian Consulate

Round Table discussion about India's economy was held on April 20, 2023, in the Indian Consulate in New York. The discussion was led by India's Vice Chairman of Niti Aayog Suman Bery, who is on a visit to the United States. Suman is the vice chairman of Niti Aayog in India.

High-profile business guests like Deepak Raj, managing director of private investment firm Raj Associates, and Dr. Sudhir Parikh, chairman of Parikh Worldwide Media and recipient of the Padma Shri award, attended the round table, which had the theme "Indian Growth Story: Speed, Scale, and Opportunities."

"It was a pleasure participating in the roundtable discussion on the Indian Growth Story: Speed, Scale and Opportunities at the Consulate General of India, New York (@IndiainNewYork) last evening," Bery, an economist who took over at NITI last year in May, tweeted after the meeting.

About 50 business leaders from a range of industries, including IT, technology, finance, healthcare, highlevel executives, and policymakers, attended the event.

Among the subjects discussed were the markers of India's economic growth making it one of the world's fastest-growing economies; elements of India's energy transition, New Delhi's Free Trade Agreements which give a strong push to Indian trade, India's G20 leadership, women's empowerment, etc.

With the aid of a visual table, Bery highlighted that the IMF projects

India's growth to be 5.9 percent in 2023 and 6.3 percent in 2024, significantly higher than the much lower world output projections of 2.8 percent and 3.0 percent.

With relevant visual representations, Bery noted that India has thus far inked 13 free trade agreements and 6 preferential agreements with its trading partners to ensure increased market access for domestic goods and promote exports. The newest free trade agreements (FTAs) were concluded with Australia, the UAE, and Mauritius.

India is also actively engaged in FTA negotiations with countries like the United Kingdom, European Union, and Canada.

India's energy transition includes elements of – increasing electrification; higher penetration of cleaner fuels in energy mix; accelerated adoption of energy-efficient technologies; rising digitalization, among other efficiencies, Bery noted.

Minister Nirmala Sitharaman addresses Indian Americans in Washington

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has said India and the US are together building a foundation for a strong, peaceful and harmonious global community. Addressing a gathering of Indian-Americans at the India House, Washington DC, the Minister wished that India-US relationship grows from strength to strength.

Addressing the Reception at India House, hosted by Indian Ambassador to US Taranjit Singh Sandhu, the US Secretary said, Modi is an unbelievable visionary leader.

On this occasion, US Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo recalled her recent meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, calling him the most popular leader of the world.

Addressing the gathering, host Indian Ambassador Sandhu said that the India-US partnership



will not only benefit the two countries but its rewards will be reaped around the globe. He said, India, the current G20 president, is ready to share its strengths and successes with the world.

India's Ambassador to US Honored with 'Sikh Hero Award'

The "Sikh Hero Award" was given to Ambassador Taranjit Singh Sandhu by Sikhs of America, an independent organization.

After accepting the honor, he delivered a speech in which he strongly condemned the separatists and addressed supporters of Khalistan.

"The Khalsa flag, which flies at the Takht (Golden Temple) and Nishan Sahibs, is a flag of unity, peace and universal love, use this symbol but do not insult it," said Sandhu in an apparent reference to the instances of violence by a small group of separatists in the US, Canada, UK and Australia holding the Khalistani flag."

"Khalsa, which was created on the Baisakhi day, by Guru Gobind Singh is a uniting and not a dividing force," he added.

"We must keep these cardinal virtues in mind and not what a couple of mischievous characters spin using virtual media," he said in an apparent reference to the so-called Khalistan leaders' messages on social media.

Sandhu encouraged the Sikh diaspora to connect with their roots and said "Punjab and the youth in Punjab need to be connected with the economic, financial, tech and digital revolution happening in India."

"The government, people and in particular the youth must take advantage of the expanding partnership with the US in various fields that Prime Minister Modi and President Biden are trying to implement," he said.

Apple CEO Tim Cook threw open the gates to the 28,000 sq ft store on April 19 to excited fans waiting for hours. Apple's second retail store in India opened in the national capital Delhi on April 20.

Soon after the opening of the first store, Cook tweeted that the energy in Mumbai is "incredible". "The energy, creativity, and passion in Mumbai is incredible! We are so excited to open Apple BKC - our first store in India," he said.

The company bills the store as one of its "most energy-efficient" in the world, saying solar panels allow it to run solely on renewable power. In a statement, Cook pointed to Apple's ongoing expansion in the country, saying its brick-and-mortar launch coincided with its 25th year of operating there.



"India has such a beautiful culture and an incredible energy," he said. "We're excited to build on our long-standing history — supporting our customers, investing in local communities, and working together to build a better future."

Cook also met with Prime Minister Narendra Modi during his visit to India to discuss the company's plans for investment and expansion in the country. Cook also spoke with Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and Minister of State for Electronics and IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar. During these discussions, Steve discussed the idea of expanding Apple's component supplier base in India, as well as plans for a Bengaluru manufacturing site and app design and development accelerator.

Missing Indian Students Found in US Lake

Bodies of two Indian students have been recovered after they went missing at a lake in the US state of Indiana, according to media reports. Siddhant Shah, 19, and Aryan Vaidya, 20, went swimming at Monroe Lake, roughly 64 miles southwest of downtown Indianapolis, with a group of friends on April 15 but didn't resurface, the *USA Today* reported.

Shah and Vaidya were boating on a pontoon on April 15 when their group anchored to swim. Both men did not resurface and friends attempted to help them but were unsuccessful, the Indiana Department of Natural Resources was quoted as saying by the newspaper.

One of the men was struggling in the water when others jumped in to help, said Lt. Angela Goldman, a Department of Natural Resources representative.

"With 15-to-20-mph sustained winds, we're struggling with that," Goldman said.

"A lot of the technology we use that makes things more precise needs better conditions. When dealing with whitecaps and wind, our sonar is not as effective." Sycamore Schools confirmed that Vaidya is a 2021 graduate of Sycamore High School.

Indian-American Engineer Found Dead in Maryland Lake

The body of a 30-year-old Indian-American software engineer, who went missing on April 9, was recovered from a lake in the US state of Maryland, police said. Ankit Bagai of German town was found in Lake Churchill by officers who were called to the area after a body was reportedly seen in the water, a Montgomery police statement said.

Ankit Bagai was last spotted on April 9 at about 11:30 am when he left a treatment centre near Milestone Plaza after which his family led a search party

and believed he may have been in Virginia or Washington DC, a *News4* report said. Ankit Bagai's family started their search at a local police station, going to several locations, including a shopping centre near where he was last seen and posted his image every few steps, hoping to generate a lead, the report said.

"On the day Bagai went missing, police responded to a report of a man in Lake Churchill. It was searched using sonar, using drag hooks, but they did not find anything. They were out there for three to four hours," Gobind Singh, Ankit Bagai's brother-in-law was quoted as saying.



Indian-Origin Engineers: Discrimination Allegations Dropped

The California Civil Rights Department CRD voluntarily withdrew its caste discrimination action against two Cisco Systems engineers, Sundar Iyer and Ramana Kompella, on April 10, 2023.

A mediation conference between Cisco and the CRD is still set for May 2.

"Two Indian-Americans endured a nearly three-year nightmare of unending investigations, a brutal online witch-hunt, and a presumption of guilt in the media after the CRD sullied their reputation alleging that they engaged in discrimination based on caste," said Suhag Shukla, Executive Director of Hindu American Foundation (HAF).

"We are thrilled that Iyer and Kompella have been vindicated along with our position that the state has no right to attribute wrongdoing to Hindu and Indian Americans simply because of their

religion or ethnicity," Shukla said.

According to court filings, Iyer, the CEO of the division, was accused of harassment based on caste despite evidence that he actively recruited "John Doe," who self-identifies as Dalit and on whose behalf CRD filed suit, and offered Doe a generous starting package with stock grants valued in the millions.

In a statement, HAF said these same court records showed that Iyer also hired at least one other self-identified Dalit who held one of the only three leadership positions in the division. This individual was also offered the other two leadership positions, including the one John Doe claimed discrimination over, prior to Doe filing his discrimination complaint, HAF said.

"This trial presents a cautionary tale of the legal morass that awaits Indians, Hindus and all South Asians, if the state of California adopts a policy that applies to only South Asians and institutionalized false and negative claims that stigmatize our community," said Samir Kalra, HAF's California based

managing director.

"If you want to know why we're opposed to ethnically profiling South Asians with the creation of caste as a stand-alone category, this case launched by the CRD is a brutal illustration of a fate that can befall any South Asian working in the state," he said.

Student Killed in US: Suspect's Photo Revealed

According to police in the US state of Ohio, a 24-year-old man from Andhra Pradesh, who was studying his Master's degree in the US, died of gunshot wounds in a reported shooting at a fuel station where the victim was working.

The student was identified as Saiesh Veera and the incident happened in the Columbus division

of the state.

"On April 20, 2023, at 12:50 am, Columbus Police officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of W. Broad St. on a reported shooting. Upon arrival, the officers located an adult male victim, identified as Saiesh Veera, M/O/24, suffering from a gunshot wound," the police said in a notification.

Columbus Fire Service personnel arrived and transported the victim to a local hospital. Despite life-saving measures, the victim was pronounced dead at 1:27 am, they said.

According to Rohit Yalamanchili, who is overseeing an online fundraiser programme to send Veera's body back to India, the young man was doing his Master's course and he got picked under the H-1B visa with his graduation just 10 days away.

He was going to quit his work as a clerk at the fuel station in a couple of weeks, Yalamanchili added.

Jyoti Thottam Wins the Christopher Award

yoti Thottam received the Christopher Award for her book "Sisters of Mokama: The Pioneering Women Who Brought Hope and Healing to India." The book is about the pioneering

Nazareth Sisters of Charity who founded a Nazareth Hospital in Mokama during the turbulent period following WWII and India's partition.

Thottam, a senior New York Times Opinion editor, wrote of Americans and Indians, including her mother, who cared for everyone who came to their hospital in Mokama, a town approximately 100 kilometers southeast of Patna, Bihar's capital, during the tumultuous years following WWII and India's partition.

The book tells about the brave and radical women who ignored societal constraints. The hospital "was run almost entirely by women, who insisted on giving the highest possible standard of care to everyone who walked through its doors, regardless of caste or religion," according to the book's website.

According to the Matters India report, Tony Rossi, The Christophers' Director of Communications, said, "The stories we're honoring acknowledge that the struggles we endure in life coexist with beauty and hope when we work together, despite our differences, to add love and healing to our world."

The award committee says the book exemplifies the Christopher motto: "It's better to light one candle than to curse the darkness."



A Visionary Leader Takes the Helm at the World Bank

jay Banga, the former CEO of Mastercard, was chosen by the World Bank's board of governors to lead the organization for a five-year term. Banga is an Indian-born finance and development expert who would restructure the bank to better address climate change and other global challenges.

Banga, 63, was nominated for the position in late February by US President Joe Biden and was the sole candidate to replace departing World Bank director David Malpass, an economist and former US Treasury official who served in the Trump administration. On June 2, he begins his new work.

The election came after World Bank board members interviewed Banga for four hours on May 1. Malpass's last day at the bank will be June 1. The decision came in a vote by 24 of the board's members, with Russia abstaining, instead of the usual consensus-based process, a source familiar with the process said.

Biden congratulated Banga on his "resounding approval" to run the World Bank, which he described as "one of humanity's most critical institutions to reduce poverty and expand prosperity around the globe."

"Ajay Banga will be a transformative leader, bringing expertise, experience, and innovation to the position of World Bank President," Biden said. "He will help steer the institution as it evolves and expands to address global challenges that directly affect its core mission of poverty reduction — including climate change."

Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen said Banga brought the "right leadership and management skills" to the job, and would play a critical role in pushing forward with additional reforms, including by forging partnerships between the public and private sectors and non-profit groups.

"Ajay understands that the challenges we face – from combating climate change, pandemics, and fragility to eliminating extreme poverty and promoting shared prosperity – are deeply intertwined. He has effectively built a broad global coalition around his vision for the Bank over the course of his candidacy," Yellen said in a statement.



Radha Iyengar Plumb Shines as Deputy Under Secretary of Defence

he US Senate confirmed Radha Iyengar Plumb, a national security expert, as the Deputy Under Secretary of Defence for Acquisition and Sustainment, making her the latest Indian-American to be chosen to a significant position by the Biden administration.

"By a vote of 68-30, the Senate

confirmed Radha Iyengar Plumb to be the Deputy Under Secretary of Defence," US Senate Periodical Press Gallery tweeted.

Prior to being named Chief of Staff, she was the Director of Research and Insights for Trust and Safety at *Google* and the Global Head of Policy Analysis at *Facebook*.

Plumb previously was a Senior Economist at the RAND Corporation where she focused on improving the measurement and evaluation of readiness and security efforts across the Department of Defence.

She previously held high positions on national security matters in the Departments of Defense, Energy, and the White House National Security Council.

She began her career as an Assistant Professor at the London School of Economics and completed her postdoctoral studies at Harvard.

Plumb received her Ph.D. and M.S. in Economics from Princeton University, and she holds a B.S. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, according to her profile released by the White House in June last year.
