# THE FORTNIGHT THAT WAS



Renowned philanthropist from Pakistan Bilquis Bano Edhi, the wife of renowned humanitarian and philanthropist Abdul Sattar Edhi, passed away on April 15, 2022, at the age of 74 after a brief hospitalisation. In 2015, she received the Mother Teresa Memorial International Award for Social Justice. She headed the Edhi Foundation, and together with her husband, their charity has saved over 16,000 unwanted babies. She also played a key role in the return of the Indian National Geeta to the homeland in 2015. In a tweet, Prime Minister Sh. Narendra Modi extended condolences and stated that she impacted the lives of people all across the world.



"Forty-one civilians, mainly women and children, were killed and 22 others were wounded in air strikes by Pakistani forces near the Durand Line in Khost province," Shabir Ahmad Osmani, director of information and culture in Khost, told AFP on April 17.

UK PM Boris Johnson, was on a two-day official tour to India, visited Sabarmati Ashram, Akshardham Temple and some other places in Gujarat. He tried his hand at spinning the charkha and left a note in the visitors' book at Mahatma Gandhi ashram. He wrote, "It is an immense privilege to come to the ashram of this extraordinary man and to understand how he mobilised such simple principles of truth and non-violence to change the world for the better." Boris Johnson was accompanied by Gujarat CM Bhupendra Patel and the UK High Commissioner to India, Alex Ellis during his visit to Akshardham Temple in Gandhinagar. Johnson was accorded a unique welcome at Gujarat Biotechnology University (GBU) as a *safa* (pagh) was wrapped around his head by a swami from Maninagar Swaminarayan Sansthan. He also inaugurated a JCB plant at Halol in Panchmahals district of Gujarat. On the second day of his visit, Boris Johnson was accorded a ceremonial reception at the Rashtrapati Bhawan in New Delhi. Johnson was received by Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Presidential palace. Later, both leaders held extensive talks at Hyderabad House in the capital with an aim to further expand cooperation in areas of defence, trade and clean energy.

# 'Russia Invades Ukraine - Aftermath'

**US President Joe Biden has said Russia's war in Ukraine amounted to "genocide," accusing President Vladimir Putin of trying to "wipe out the idea of even being a Ukrainian."**

**The US Treasury earlier this month blocked Russia from paying \$650 million due on two bonds using funds held at American banks. Russia has instead tried to pay in rubles, but credit rating agencies have said this would constitute a default. According to leading economists, Russia's debt default will be one of the hardest in history to resolve and could see the US seize the central bank's assets, Though Russia still has a grace period in which to make dollar payments on its foreign bonds, analysts say a default is more likely to happen.**

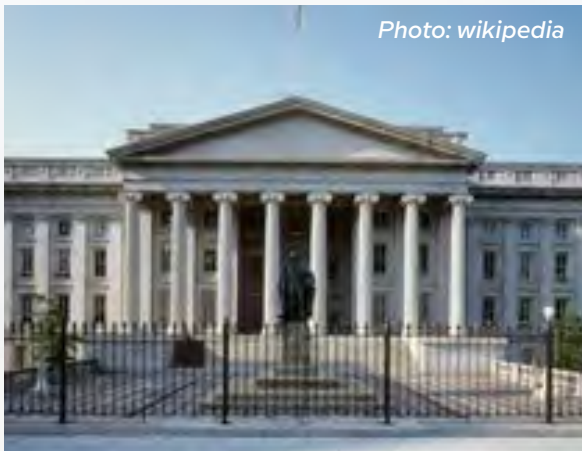

# 2 Sikh Men Attacked in Alleged Hate Crime In New York

The attack on the two men, who were out on a stroll early in the morning, is said to have occurred at the same spot where a member of the community was attacked a few days back

**O**n Tuesday, April 12, two Sikh men were assaulted in an alleged hate crime in the Richmond Hills neighbourhood of New York, US.

The Consulate General of India in New York has condemned the assault, terming it "deplorable," and said they were in touch with the police who are investigating this incident. One person has been arrested in connection with the crime, it said.

According to local media reports, two suspects hit the men with a pole and removed their turbans.

New York Attorney General Letitia James, condemning

the attack, tweeted: "Another hateful attack against our Sikh community in Richmond Hill. Both individuals who were responsible must be brought to justice. Anyone with information about this should immediately

contact @NYPDnews."

NY State Assemblywoman Jenifer Rajkumar, the first Punjabi American ever elected to New York State Office, said that there has been an "alarming 200per

cent rise in hate crimes against the Sikh community in recent years".

"I spoke to the NYPD soon after both of this week's incidents against my Sikh American family. I am calling for both incidents to be investigated as hate crimes, and that the perpetrators be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law," Ms Rajkumar said in a statement.

"We will educate all on Sikh culture so that everyone knows as I do the generosity and kindness embedded in the Sikh American community," Ms Rajkumar, who is a former Director of Immigration for NY State, added.

## WHO Traditional Medicine Center opens in India

**T**he World Health Organization launched its Global Centre for Traditional Medicine in India on Tuesday, which will aim to unlock its potential by blending ancient practices with modern science.

On Tuesday, April 19th, Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of the World Health Organisation (WHO) Global Centre for Traditional Medicine (GCTM) in Jamnagar. The WHO chief, Tedros Ghebreyesus, and the Prime Minister of Mauritius, Shri Pravind Kumar Jugnauth, were present at the event.

The WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine is a recognition of India's contribution

and potential in this field. India's traditional medicine system is not limited only to treatment. It is a holistic science of life. India takes this partnership as a huge responsibility for serving humanity, PM Modi said. The GCTM has been set up by the Ministry of Ayush and the WHO.

"I am happy that by giving the slogan 'One Planet, Our Health', WHO has promoted the Indian vision of 'One Earth, One Health'. It is a matter of immense pride for India that 2023 has been chosen as the International Year of Millets by the United Nations," PM Modi also said.

Meanwhile, the WHO chief said, "Traditional medicine products are abound globally, and the center will go a long

way in bringing the promise of traditional medicine to fruition. The new center will focus on data, innovation and sustainability and will optimize the use of traditional medicine. He noted that the WHO global center for traditional medicine is a truly global project".

"Through this center, India will be able to take its knowledge of traditional medicine to the world, and similarly, the world will come to India. He thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi for his support in establishing this center in India."

## US FDA Approves 1st Covid Breath Diagnostic Test

After two months of plummeting COVID cases across the US, the virus is on the rise again, with the Northeast accounting for many of the new cases.

Philadelphia became the first major city to bring back

the indoor mask mandate. Meanwhile, the FDA has granted emergency use authorization to the first Covid-19 test that can detect the coronavirus in a breath sample within minutes and with a high degree of accuracy.

As per the FDA on April 15,

the test may be done in venues where the patient samples are both gathered and processed, such as doctor's offices, hospitals, and mobile testing sites, utilizing an instrument roughly the size of a piece of carry-on baggage. The results are available in

approximately 3 minutes.

"Today's authorization is yet another example of the rapid innovation occurring with diagnostic tests for COVID-19," said Jeff Shuren, Director of the FDA's Center for Devices and Radiological Health.

# India's Foreign Minister attends Ambedkar anniversary at Indian Consulate, New York

**T**he Indian Consulate in New York commemorated DR. B.R. Ambedkar, the author of India's Constitution, on April 14, 2022, the 131st anniversary of his birth. The event was attended by India's Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar, who is on a visit to the United States and participating in the 2+2 conference with top US counterparts in Washington, DC. Speaking at the ceremony, FM Jaishankar emphasized that Ambedkar's beliefs are even more pertinent now, as India

marks the 75th anniversary of its independence. And the greatest approach to achieve his ideas and objectives was to expand liberties. "The legacy that he gave us as the architect of India's Constitution, which he bequeathed to us, has actually become even more valuable with the passage of time," Jaishankar said, adding that Ambedkar's aspirations "are actually the blueprint to guide us ... and provide a compass for clarity," as the world is again debating the virtues of democracy.



# India a net provider of regional security, says US

**T**he two countries – the world's oldest and largest democracies – have agreed to launch defense supply chain cooperation to quickly meet each other's priority needs during conflict situations, as the two countries broadened the scope of their defense and security cooperation, with Washington recognizing India as a defense industry leader in the Indo-Pacific and a net provider of security in the region.

Unveiling several defense initiatives between India and the US at a news conference after the 2+2 meeting on Monday, he said, "Today we agreed to launch new supply chain cooperation measures that will let us more swiftly support each other's priority defense requirements".

"India continues to acquire key

US defense platforms, and that is forging important and new ties between our defense industrial bases", he said.

"Our defense trade and technology cooperation continue to grow. We recently concluded an agreement to work together on air-launched unmanned aerial vehicles through our Defense Technology and Trade Initiative", Austin said.

"We're doing all this because the United States supports India as a defense industry leader in the Indo-Pacific and a net provider of security in the region", he said.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh mentioned that he has spoken to US companies to make India a leader in aerospace manufacturing and has been discussing co-development and co-production.

Laying out the rationale for Indo-US defense cooperation, Austin said, "As strategic threats converge, especially following Russia's invasion of Ukraine, it is more important than ever that we stand together to defend our shared values and to preserve the international rules-based order".

He also spoke of the threat from China which "is seeking to refashion the region and the international system more broadly in ways that serve its interests", he said. India and the US were deepening cooperation in cyberspace, "including through training and exercises later this year" and "expanding our information-sharing partnership across all warfighting domains", he said.

US and India have committed to do more high-end exercises together, Austin said. "We're looking forward to more of this sort of cooperation as we expand the scope and the complexity of Tiger Triumph, which is our annual major tri-service exercise", he added.

He also welcomed the Indian Navy to join the Combined Maritime Forces, Bahrain, a US-led group of over 30 countries that works on counter-narcotics, counter-smuggling and suppressing piracy.

## Joe Biden Nominates Indian-American Diplomat Rachna Sachdeva as His Envoy for Mali

**U**S President Joe Biden has nominated Indian-American diplomat Rachna Sachdeva Korhonen as his envoy to Mali, the White House has said, the third such nomination of an Indian-American in over a month.

A career member of the US Foreign Service, Ms. Korhonen currently serves as Deputy Assistant Secretary and the Executive Director of the combined Executive Offices of the State Department's Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs and the Bureau of South and Central Asian Affairs.

The White House stated in a statement on Friday that she previously served as the Consul General and Principal Officer of the US Consulate in Dharan, Saudi Arabia.

# Indian-American Navy Veteran Shanti Sethi Appointed Kamala Harris' Defence Adviser

**S**hanti Sethi, the first Indian-American commander of a major US Navy combat ship, recently joined Vice President Harris' office, Politico quoted Vice President's senior adviser Herbie Ziskend as saying.

According to her LinkedIn page, Shanti Sethi coordinates National Security Adviser documentation across the Vice President's Office.

From December 2010 until May 2012, Shanti Sethi commanded the guided-missile destroyer USS

Decatur. In addition, she was the first female commander of a US military warship to visit India.

When she entered the Navy in 1993, the combat exclusion legislation was still in place, so her options were limited. However, when she was an officer, the Exclusion Act was lifted.

"I was able to move on to have a career path that was much more open to me because I was going into this very male-dominated environment," Shanti Sethi told *USA Today* in an interview last year.

### Indians Continue Their Hold On H-1B Visas

In 2021, Indians held roughly three-fourths of the H-1B visas given by the US to speciality foreign workers, extending their stronghold on this highly sought-after professional ticket to work, live, and, eventually, settle in America.

According to the latest data on this issue released recently by the Department of Homeland Security, the government department that handles immigration, the US accepted 407,071 H-1B petitions in 2021, with 301,616 of them – 74.1 per cent – for Indian employees.

In 2020, Indians accounted for 74.9 per cent of all authorized petitions.

The United States authorizes American firms to hire speciality foreign employees on H-1B visas for occupations that cannot be filled by local Americans. Top American corporations including Microsoft, Amazon, Google, and Facebook, as well as US subsidiaries of Indian IT firms such as Infosys, TCS, and Wipro, are among the most active users of this visa program.

### More Central NJ school districts add DIWALI to their holiday list

More Central Jersey school districts will be closed to students on October 24, the day of the Hindu festival of Diwali, the Festival of Lights.

In all, 10 districts are canceling classes for the religious holiday, continuing a trend started in recent years to recognize the area's growing diversity.

For the 2022–23 school year, students and staff in Hillsborough and Bridgewater-Raritan will have the day off for the first time.

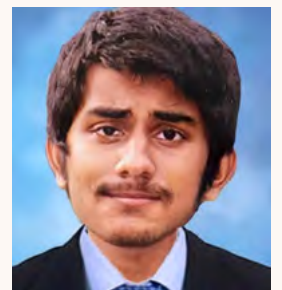
For many years, Edison has marked Diwali with a day off, as have South Brunswick, Piscataway, Sayreville and Bernards.

East Brunswick, Montgomery and Monroe will close schools for students, but staff members will participate in in-service sessions.

Rajan Zed, president of the Universal Society of Hinduism, said recognizing Diwali in a school calendar with school closures is a step in the "positive direction" because there are a "substantial number of Hindu students" in schools around the state. He added that it is "important to meet the religious and spiritual

After a prayer song by GOPIO-Edison President Pallavi Belwariar, a moment of silence was observed for the victims of Russia's war in Ukraine and for the passing away of GOPIO-Life Member and community

leader Yash Paul Soi earlier this month.

Library Director Allan Kleiman said he was very excited by this collection and told that these books can be issued to anyone in the Middlesex County. He then introduced Library President Patricia Massey, who welcomed the availability of classic India-related books and Indian language books from the library.

GOPIO International Chairman Dr. Thomas Abraham, who initiated this effort, said that New Jersey has one of the largest concentrations of Indian Americans and to serve our community members as well as to improve the understanding of India among the local population, GOPIO has joined hands with the Govt. of India through its Consulate in New York to launch the India Collection of Books at Edison Public Library with several hundred books, including several classics and Indian language books in Hindi, Urdu, Gujarati, Assamese and other languages.

Speaking on the occasion, Consul General Randhir Jaiswal spoke about the vibrant library system in America that helps spread knowledge and makes it a developed country. He said that American Indian partnership is crucial for world peace and security and lauded the efforts of the Diaspora in getting this initiative to Edison. He said that the libraries in the USA are the best in the world and making Indian books available through this system will help the Diaspora with the availability of rare Indian books.

GOPIO Vice President Ram Gadhvi, who is also chairman of the Gujarati Literary Academy, contributed over 60 Gujarati books to this initiative, saying that the libraries would not be outdated in spite of digitalization and that many new Indian immigrants feel comfortable reading a hard copy of the book.

Newly reorganized GOPIO-Edison President Pallavi Belwariar spoke on the chapter's plans to organize many community service programs in Edison and nearby areas, including supporting and volunteering at soup kitchens, youth programs, and welcoming new Indian students to attend nearby Rutgers University.

Federation of Indian Associations President Kenny Desai said that there was nothing more pious than knowledge. He lauded the community for the initiative to donate a huge

collection of books and make them available to the Public in Edison and the East Coast.

Dr. Sudhir Parikh, a recipient of the Govt. of India's Padma Shri award, recognized the legends of the community. He said that education is the best charitable activity that one can give to anyone. He also said that he ensured that his newspaper is distributed across all libraries in NJ.



One of the main organizers of the event, Pradeep "Peter" Kothari, a veteran community leader recognized the work by many Indian American leaders and thanked the town council members for attending. He said someone should write a book on how the community evolved over the past 35 years and said he was happy to see the community at a comfort zone at present. Kothari then introduced members of Edison Council and nearby towns.

Edison Town Council Vice President Joyce Ship-Freeman complimented the Indian Consulate, GOPIO-Edison and the library for this new initiative. Retired as a literary coach, Councilwoman Ship-Freeman has said that library is her second home and that books are still an important medium of knowledge.

Edison Councilman Ajay Patil said that he had been wanting this for the last 4 years and thanked everyone involved in getting this initiative to its fruition. Piscataway Councilman Kapil Shah said that he had been doing community work for 31 years and said that he was the first to get a grant from NJ state for video and books for the local library a couple of years back. He said that books were still the authentic source of knowledge.

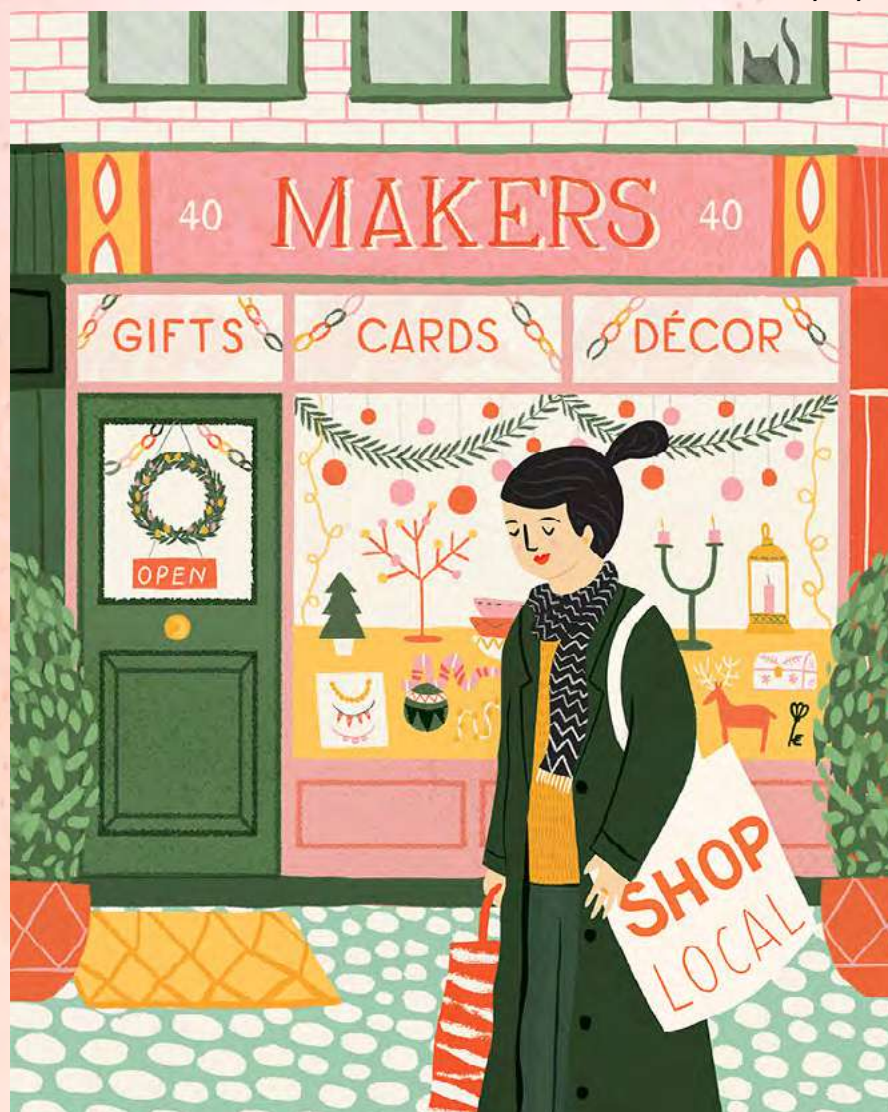
Thankfully, we had done

### Plot

The story runs in a back-and-forth narrative in three timelines. We get introduced to Arjun Talwar's life in the past and present. A dashing cricketer, his beautiful girlfriend, Vidya, their love and a promising future.

An ex-cricketer, a broken man, a failing husband, but a doting father to a 7-year-old Kittu.

The story goes on to join the dots in between and gives us glimpses of the aggressive, confident player, dashing lover that he was, his terrible current life in pieces and how he gathers up himself to boom back.

### Analysis

The star of the film literally and figuratively is Shahid Kapoor (Arjun) who carries the film on his shoulder. The actor who has set his benchmark with fantastic performances in the likes of *Jab We Met*, *Uda Punjab*, *Haider* and *Kabir Singh* has always boasted of intensity in

his portrayals.

As Arjun, he adds heft to the character with the varied range of emotions he displays. The stubborn streak, the aggression, seething anger, the quiet pain, the recklessness, the broken

man, the loving father and husband.

You would pity him, be angry at him and at times feel like shaking him out of his madness.

His relationship with his son touches a chord. His track with Mrunal and the dire straits of their marital life breaks your heart.

The sports parts of the film

(the cricket matches), though over simplified, try to add euphoria in this otherwise emotionally heavy drama.

Mrunal Thakur makes Vidya look lovely, adorable, vulnerable and strong at the same time. She gives a good

range to her character and plays it well.

Rohit Kamra as Kittu is great.

Pankaj Kapoor is superb as coach and mentor Bali.

These actors leave no stone unturned and make sure we are emotionally invested in the film.

Direction wise, you can see the finesse and detailing is

great. The film definitely has its heart in the right place.

But just as life doesn't run on emotions alone, neither does a film.

The film despite the heavy dose of emotions (and I think that could also be a reason) remains banal for most parts. So much so that even the cricket portions fail to create magic. Too much melodrama, too less entertainment I would say.

The basic plot which seems far-fetched at times, Arjun's failings, his stubbornness gets on your nerves at times. There are too many "oh! Why the hell can't he do this" moments!

Seeing things go downhill most of the time takes a toll on you after all. By the time the story gives you moments to feel inspired and overwhelmed, it's too late and we felt kind of exhausted.

The music being very mediocre and forgettable, didn't help at all. The run time of 2 hr 50 min is overtly long and tiring.
