dison New Jersey - The 3rd Parade Council Meeting was held on 19th May 2023 at Akbar Restaurant.


FIA Secretary General Nishi Dhami opened the meeting and introduced the agenda to the audience.

Incla's Independence US Lawmakers of Bipartisan leadership invite Honorable India's PM Narendra Modi to address a **Joint Address to Congress**

o-chairs of the bipartisan Congressional Caucus on India and Indian Americans issued a letter on May 23, 2023, requesting Kevin McCarthy to invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi to deliver a joint address to Congress.

The bipartisan leadership of an Indian-focused group of US Lawmakers of the House of Representatives: Cochairs of the Congressional Caucus and Indian-Americans, Congressman Ro Khanna, D-California and Michael Waltz, R-Florida initiated a letter on May 23, 2023, to Speaker of House Kevin McCarthy requesting to extend an invitation to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for delivering a joint address to

congress during his upcoming state visit at June.

The letter begins by, "As we celebrate the 75th anniversary of India's independence and U.S. - India relations, we write to you as Co-Chairs of the bipartisan Congressional Caucus on India and Indian Americans with a shared commitment to strengthening the bilateral relationship between the United States and India."

The aim of this joint letter is that by inviting a joint address to Congress, Reps. Khanna and Waltz laid out the importance of strengthening and highlighting the partnership along with the bilateral relationship between India and the United States.

"As State Dinners have come to signify the President's utmost respect for visiting heads of state, granting a joint address to Congress is a commensurate honor for the leader of the world's largest democracy and perhaps the most critical partner to countering China in the 21st century," the lawmakers wrote.

H-1B Visas for Hiring Foreign Health Professionals Bill introduced in US

ongresswomen Rashida Tlaib and Delia Ramirez on Wednesday introduced, the 'Expansion in Health Care Providers for Veterans Act'

The legislation was introduced the aim to hire foreign healthcare professionals on H-1B visas to help the United States Department of Veteran Affairs to meet the medical needs of people in the US. The Expanding Health Care Providers for Veterans Act was introduced by Congresswomen Rashida Tlaib and Delia Ramirez on Wednesday.

Department of Veterans Affairs and State Veterans Homes as capexempt institutions for the H1-B visa programme are particularly

designated in the Bill.

"Our veterans deserve high-quality healthcare, and our district knows first-hand the importance of providing access to care, especially mental health services, for veterans who need it the most," Tlaib said. "We cannot just express our gratitude to our veterans for their service to our country, we must do more to ensure that every veteran has the support they need to live healthy lives," she said.

"I am proud to introduce this

legislation to expand healthcare providers for our veterans by welcoming health professionals who are immigrants to care for them, and I will continue to ensure that our veterans are not forgotten when they return home," Tlaib said.

Congresswoman Delia Ramirez, a member of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs, said about the necessity of the Bill, "We have a duty to uphold our commitment to our veterans, who are being affected by the health worker shortage in our nation."

"We can address this shortage with the immigrants in our communities who are ready and want to work, but face so many hurdles to do so. We can and must address this," she said.

The Expanding Health Care Providers for Veterans Act was introduced due to hiring difficulties imposed by the H1-B visa cap, Detroit VA Medical Centre was on the verge of closing down its methadone clinic which provided life-saving care to more than 90 local veterans.

Tlaib's intervention helped to prevent complete closure of the clinic and the Bill was introduced to avoid such a situation in the future, a media release said.

Neil Makhija nominated for Montgomery County Commissioner race

Neil Makhija possibly will be the first Asian American and first Indian American to serve as the Commissioner in Montgomery County which is the highly populated AAPI district.

The American Politician Makhija was first elected for democratic nomination on May 16 for the Montgomery County, Pennsylvania commissioner's seat. He is also the Lecturer of Law at University of Pennsylvania Carey Law School and Executive Director of Indian American Impact, the Nation's leading South Asian civic organization.

There are two open spots on the three-member Montgomery County Board of Commissioners for which Five Democrats and three Republicans are contesting against each other. Democratic nominations were secured by Makhija and Jamila Winder. Now, four of these candidates will head to the Nov. 7 general election and only two of them with the highest votes will secure the open Commissioners' seats.

Maryland Lt. Governor Aruna Miller tweeted congratulating Makhija: "Congratulations to my friend, Neil Makhija, on becoming the Democratic nominee for Montgomery County Commissioner!" Rep. Pramila Jayapal from D-Washington also congratulated Makhija through a tweet.

Public Interest Lawyer Makhija also stated in his May 17 letter to supporters, "At a time when our fundamental rights and democracy itself are on the line, voters of Montgomery County chose a candidate who will fight to protect democratic principles and values." He thanked his wife, Dr. Rachel Nash, for winning the primary election, and said, "We ran a positive campaign and inspired a new and diverse coalition of voters to turn out to vote in every corner of the county."

The 36-year-old Lawyer and the representative of IMPACT has \$842,000 for his primary bid which is more than all of his opponents combined, reported The Philadelphia Inquirer. Makhija stated that he aims for expanding mental health services, build more housing for low-income and un-housed people, and a plan for addressing the climate change.



Indian-American Duo reaches Finals for European Inventor Award

The Indian-American duo are leading in the race of European Inventor Award, the result will be declared on July 4 in Valencia, Spain.

The award was launched by the European Patent Office (2006). The Indian Professor Kripa Varanasi working together with his American student and competition partner David Smith from Massachusetts Institute of Technology is bolstering the race for European Inventor Award and has secured their position as the finalist. Since 2013, the votes of the public invited have chosen the winner of a Popular Prize among the finalists.

The invention of the duo, the LiquiGlide was founded in 2012 and assists in the dispersion of viscous liquids such as mayonnaise, lotion, as well as glue, in easy and frictionless manner from their textured packaging. Also, helpful in the Skincare and Dental Hygiene Industry. Biotechnology companies create a customised chemical coating for medical products in a vast range.

The coating is the first of its kind which repels the products present in the packaging and helps in aiding the process of smooth and effortless discharge of waste products like tomato ketchup, toothpaste, paint and many such products leaving no traces behind. Study shows that it takes around 500 years to fully biodegrade a toothpaste tube and globally over one billion toothpaste tubes are disposed of in the land-fills annually.

The idea for the invention was inspired by the conversation between Varanasi and his wife when she was struggling to retrieve honey from a jar. The Varanasi Smith duo has already won the Audience Choice Award at the MIT-\$100K business plan competition causing "a perfect storm of great things that came together," as Varanasi describes. The final event will be streamed online for those who are interested.



RRR Director Rajamouli pays Tribute to Actor Ray Stevenson


The blockbuster Film RRR Director SS Rajamouli pays tribute to late Ray Stevenson saying: "Working With Him Was Pure Joy."

The 58 year old actor passed away with the cause of death unknown. The Villain of RRR film was also famous for his renowned role in "Thor" movies and Two Star Wars Series. The actor was remembered by Director SS Rajamouli on Tuesday who played the role of Villainous British Governor, Sir Scott in RRR and said that he was someone that brought "infectious" energy to film sets.

Stevenson died in Italy on Sunday, four days before his 59th birthday, his publicist confirmed with entertainment website Variety. No cause of death was available. In a Twitter post, Rajamouli said that it was shocking and posted a throwback picture with Stevenson on RRR sets: "... Just can't believe this news. Ray brought in so much energy and vibrancy with him to the sets. It was infectious. Working with him was pure joy. My prayers are with his family. May his soul rest in peace."

The official Twitter page of RRR, shared a behind-the-scenes photo of the late actor filming a crucial action scene in the movie and the tweet reads: "He was 56 years old when we were shooting this difficult scene but he did not hesitate while performing this stunt. We will forever cherish having you on the sets of #RRR, Ray Stevenson. Gone too soon,"





PEN American Gala honored Salman Rushdie

Author Salman Rushdie's first emotional and unexpected appearance in PEN'S American Literary Gala to receive PEN's Centenary Courage Award.

Rushdie's first appearance attending the annual gala of Poets, Essayists, Novelists (PEN) America, a non-profit organisation of writers focused on freedom of expression through literature, by giving the event's final speech as he accepted a special prize, the PEN Centenary Courage Award, just nine months after being stabbed repeatedly and hospitalised.

He addressed his award to all the people who rescued him at that event. He said, "I accept this award, primarily on behalf of those who came to my rescue and saved my life. I was the target that day, but they were the heroes."

On this occasion, Rushdie dedicated his whole 8-minute speech praising every person who helped him throughout his journey of recovery. He surprised the audience on May 18 by his appearance in the PEN American Gala.

He allured the audience with his witty lines: "It's nice to be back as opposed to not being back, which was also an option. I'm pretty glad the dice rolled this way."

Rushdie also acknowledged reporters by saying that his first appearance will be on PEN: "I've had such a long relationship with PEN. If there was an event to choose (to make my first appearance) it had to be this one."

Novelist Rushdie was the PEN America President (2004) and served his tenure of two years. In his speech, he said, "It is a way of coming back to the world of books, of human rights: the world I have inhabited all my life. I'm happy to be back in it."








Goldwater Scholarship awarded to Subhashish Mukherjee

Subhashish Mukherjee is among the 413 scholars named in the Barry Goldwater Scholarship 2023. The scholar is a junior at the Mellon College of Science chosen from a group of more than 5,000 college sophomores and juniors. The Barry Goldwater Scholarships have been awarded to around the top 10,000s since its inception.

Each Goldwater Scholar is provided with an annual sum up to a maximum amount of US\$7,500 for an academic year. This sum is sufficient enough for their cost of tuition, required fees, books and lodging, and they are relieved from boarding financial aid received from other sources as their expectation from them is reduced.

Mukherjee, the Carnegie Mellon University student who studies mathematical sciences, was congratulated by Richelle Bernazzoli, director of the Office of Undergraduate Research and Scholar Development, stating that, "Our 2023 Goldwater Scholars highlight CMU's strengths in key areas of mathematics and science research."



Mukherjee has a keen engagement with Linear Algebra through Matrix theory and has served as a teaching assistant for it twice at Mellon University. "It made me want to do more math," Mukherjee said. "It was my favourite class when I got here, and I think it's my favourite class too TA." He has served as TA four times and helped students to understand vector analysis by Matrix theory which focuses on the aspects of linear algebra.

In 2022 Mukherjee started working with Ian Tice, an Associate Professor of Mathematical Sciences, their studies' primary focus was on the nonlinear partial differential equations and his work on function spaces enables researchers to identify novel characteristics of differential equations. About this Tice said, "Subhashish has displayed remarkable prowess in undergraduate math research." He also added, "This is due to a combination of his remarkable drive and passion for math as well as the extensive training he received in the math department's Honors Program. We expect a very bright future for him."

Subhashish is further aspiring to start Ph.D. in Mathematics as he will complete his graduation in 2023. While continuing teaching, he wants to study by adopting an interdisciplinary strategy so that he may work in many fields while honing his mathematical abilities and making new connections.



Indian-Origin NYPD Officer awarded by Presidential Medal of Valour

umit Sulan, an Indian origin and a New York Police officer was honoured by President Joe Biden with the Medal

of Valour.

On the day of the incident they received a call from a distressed woman who was threatened by his son, her son was attacking both the woman and her brother.

They reached the place of incidence and as Sulan was a rookie, he was with the victimized woman and son and the two senior First grade detectives Mora and Rivera engaged with the aggravated man and they got injured by the Gunman. Now, Sulan took charge of the situation and used his service weapon and struck down the gunnan. He handled the whole deadly incident within 45 seconds from the point of beginning.

Due to his bravery and courageous decision he was able to save the lives of the civilians and protected his seniors



while handling the deadly situation single handedly. Officer Sulan was promoted with the rank of detective

on February 22. According to a tweet by Commission Sewell, he was presented with shield No. 332, "symbolizing three brothers from the 32nd Precinct."

Praising the efforts of Sulan, the President said, "There's no greater responsibility of the government than to ensure the safety of the American people and those who serve and protect us all. We're incredibly proud of all of you, and I mean that. We're going to have your back as long as we need to." He also added that, "To the honourees, I don't know all of you, but I do know you. From small towns to big cities, you're cut from the same cloth. You run into danger when everyone runs away."

Prof. Emerita Vidya Dehejia of Columbia University received Freer Medal

idya Dehejia is an Indian and South Asian Art Professor, the Barbara Stoler Miller and Emerita of Indian and South Asian Art in Columbia University is the 14th Recipient of the Freer medal 2023 by Smithsonian



National Museum of Art.

Dehejia is the first scholar of South Asian art to receive Freer Medal for understanding the arts of Asia throughout their career, recognising her dedication to Indian and South Asian Art Smithsonian remarked: "Dehejia's ground-breaking research spans millennia of art and history, from ancient Buddhist rock-cut architecture colonial-period photography."

Dehejia published 24 books and many papers in the field of Indian and South Asian Art throughout her career and shaped generations of scholars for decades. About this Smithsonian noted that "At Columbia University, as professor of South Asian art history from 1982 to 2003 and as the Barbara Stoler Miller Professor of Indian and South Asian Art from 2003 to 2021."

Her are works recognised and highlighted by Smithsonian are: "Devi,

Indian-Americans Esteemed with Ellis Medal of Honor

llis Medal of Honor annually represents both American and naturalized citizens of America. Formerly known as NECO (National Ethnic Coalition of Organizations) is now Ellis Island Honors Society (EIHS).

According to the organisation, the Medal recognizes citizens who are: "Individuals who have made it their mission to share with those less fortunate, their wealth of knowledge, indomitable courage, boundless compassion, unique talents and selfless generosity. They do so while acknowledging their debt to their ethnic heritage as they uphold the ideals and spirit of America."

Chennai-born Indian Americans Chandrika Tandon and Ram Shriram are among the other 90 individuals who are honored with this medal.

Tandon is a Grammy-nominated artist for her album "Soul Call" and an Indian American Businesswoman. The chair of the President's Global Council, and chair of the board of the

Tandon School of Engineering. She was also the Inaugural distinguished alumnus of both the Indian Institute of Management, Ahmedabad (IIMA) and Madras Christian College (MCC).

Ram Shriram is a philanthropist and an Indian American Businessman; he was one of the first investors and founding brothers of Google. He is a technology industry insider for more

than 30 years. In 2008 and 2009 he was number three on the Forbes list of top tech deal makers.

EIHS was established in 1984, and its medal has been awarded annually since 1986, also, officially recognised by both the United State House of Representatives and United States Senate and in the past, has honoured eight Presidents of the USA.







Tata Sons Head honoured with France's Highest Civilian Award

ata Sons Chairman Natarajan Chandrasekaran is honoured with the Highest Civilian Award by France's Legion National Order of the Legion of Honour.

He is the first non-Parsi and professional executive to head the Tata Group.

Legion of Honour is the highest rank in both civil, merit and military, it was founded by Napoleon Bonaparte in 1802. Chandrasekaran is awarded for enhancing the relationship France and India. France is the 11th largest investor in India which incorporates 1.70% of total direct investment inflows into India. Apart from that India is the largest scientific partner of France with over 25 research and development centres and 15 Indo-French Research Laboratories. Tata has deep-embedded relations with France as Jamshedji Ratan Tata was born in Paris and was half-French. A picture of Natarajan with Elon Musk is also tweeted on Tesla Club India which depicts that he is followed, recognised and honoured globally.

Natarajan Chandrasekaran was appointed as chair of B20 India and he was appointed as CEO in 2009. He was also the chairman of Tata Motors and Total Global Beverages. He also got a five-year extension as the chairman of Tata Sons, and is the promoter of more than 100 companies with total annual revenue generated more than

\$100 billion.

He was also Director on the Board of India's Central Bank and Reserve Bank of India, in 2016. Additionally, he was appointed to the International Advisory Council of Singapore's Economic Development Board in 2016.



Indian American wins Cutler Bell Prize for High School Computing

rihaasa Nallamothu, including the three other high-school students won Cutler Bell Prize.

The Cutler Bell Prize was founded in 2015 by avid Cutler and Gordon Bell. The award was introduced to promote and encourage students in computer science, to empower young and aspiring high school students in the USA. Gordon Bell and David Cutler Endowment Fund is financially supporting the award by a \$1 million endowment.

All the four recipients including Nallamothu will each be awarded a \$10,000 prize and a trip to the ACM/CSTA Cutler-Bell Prize Reception. Sirihaasa Nallamothu of University High School in Normal, Illinois' project that was selected by a panel of judges was based on ingenuity, complexity, relevancy and originality.

Sirihaasa used Modern technology and computer science for her project

to address the research gap to predict Vasovagal Syncope which leads to sudden drop in heart rate and blood pressure leading to faintingin Patients with Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS).

According to a news release, Sirihaasa is the first person to conduct an Institutional Review Board research study and collect human



subject field data on POTS patients in the real world using non-invasive technologies.

Her project was inspired by a Tiktok video and after some research she found that there is no study on the issue or consumer solutions to predict syncope on real-world data.

She wrote a Python script to extract the 15-minute window signal data of heart rate, blood volumetric pressure, EDA, temperature, and accelerometer data, the release added.

Girls Who Code club was founded by Nallamothu at her Middle school, which developed and taught coding curriculum/activities, managed grants/funding. Also networked and planned events.

Sirihaasa plans to work toward creating a consumer product and pairing her algorithm with a smart watch, after the completion of her research.

Dahaad is a stinging social commentary cleverly woven into the warp and weft of an extremely gritty thriller that keeps you on tenterhooks.

In a small town in Rajasthan, a plucky policewoman, Anjali Bhati (Sonakshi) unearths a string of cases of missing girls that could be linked to each other. As revelations mount up, so does the difficulty of the police to nail the culprit.

The audience have been made privy to the perpetrator. It is not a whodunnit but a procedural thriller which, in the course of investigation, gives us a glaring look into the social milieu that is an equal culprit for the fate of the girls.

As the chase quickens up, so do our heartbeats. The cold simplicity with which crimes have been done is scary, the culprit terrifying and the reasons that enabled all this with such ease is heartbreaking.

Somewhere amidst all this crime drama, we see a woman fighting out tenaciously against caste and gender prejudice, departmental politics, repugnant male gaze and societal pressure to conform.

There's an honest police officer struggling at home front against deep rooted conditioning.

There's an ambitious officer ,with an honest heart within, who is struggling with his inner fears.

The characters are well etched out and each of their sub-story is a character study that has something to convey. So do most dialogues, conversations, gestures, looks, even the poem/ story being read.

It is actually the way they have infused the subtextual that sets it apart.

There's so much they say and how!

Casteism, patriarchy, caste politics, corruption, misogyny, gender prejudice, societal pressures and conditioning ,marital relationship, dowry and most prominently -plight of the marginalised. The sheer list shouldn't put you off. You'll have to watch this stellar piece of cinema put together by two amazing filmmakers to see how cleverly they have done SO.

The pace is slow in first two episodes but picks up its grip on you as it proceeds, becomes very taut 5th onwards but the last episode seems tad hurried. Performances have a lot to their credit in bringing to life this well written and well directed drama.

Those who thought Vijay Varma is loathsome in Darlings, will have to watch this one. The man defines sheer terror. As a simple well behaved, educated, soft spoken family man, without an iota of help from dramatised looks or gestures or actions, he brings to the table

something beyond Darlings. Gulshan Devaiah as Sonakshi's senior is fabulous. That soft toned voice quality and the effortless naturalism he lends to his characters is what I love most about him. And man, the way he emotes with just his expressions! Sohum Shah, mostly seen in serious roles, is superb in a lighter role this time. Together these three amazing actors add heft to the show.

Sonakshi looks dashing as the straight faced (too straight faced to be honest) and resolute policewoman (loved her riding the bike like a pro).

She gives her best and it felt good to see such actors pushing the envelope, so much more than being song and dance prop and playing aide to mega heroes.Her performance though lacked the nuance that the character deserved.

The show is recommended for not only being a gritty slow burn thriller, with a fine set of performances, (one of which has raised the bar and is already the talk of the town) but for the way it leaves your hearts and mind resonating with its dahaad!

Sydney Film Festival screens hits of **Amitabh Bachchan**



The outstanding combination of high-voltage action and drama with great music is the significant constant in Bachchan's films.




