Governor Murphy, Mayor Joshi and County Commissioners Announce Promising Plans for Middlesex College

College iddlesex go through will significant makeover that will allow it to continue to address academic, cultural, athletic, and civic needs well into the future. Governor Murphy, Mayor Sam Joshi and Commissioner Director Ron Rios unveiled the plans before a full house of onlookers at the College's West Hall.

"This is incredible news for the residents of Edison, the County and the entire State," stated Mayor Joshi. "This type of vision and significant investment is exactly what happens when local, county and state leaders come together under a shared policy initiative. Our residents' lives will be significantly enhanced because of the educational, athletic, cultural and civic improvements we are announcing here today."

Today's announcement was the result of a shared goal that culminated in the County's Community, Innovation, and Opportunity Strategic Investment Plan. The Plan calls for:

- 1. An open-air Multipurpose Community Venue for concerts, cultural events, and multiple sports such as baseball, soccer, or lacrosse
- 2. A Workforce Development & Conference Center
- 3. A new Community Park featuring an educational children's amenity
- 4. A new Student Center which will include campus and community amenities
- 5. A new Middlesex County Magnet School, the Middlesex County Magnet School of the Future
- 6. A Destination Athletic Complex featuring 14 multisport synthetic fields;16 tennis courts and a state-ofthe-art recreational cricket



field; and much more

7. An expansion of the existing exterior spaces, activating these areas by adding public art, seating, and water features.

According to the County's press release, dignitaries shared the significance of these investments in education and infrastructure in Middlesex County and the positive impact they will have on its students, staff, parents, and the region. Today's program included Governor Phil D. Murphy; New Jersey General Assembly Speaker Craig J. Coughlin; Middlesex County Commissioner Director Ronald G. Rios: Edison Mavor Sam Joshi; Middlesex College President Mark McCormick; Superintendent of Schools Jorge E. Diaz; Middlesex County Administrator John A. Pulomena; and Middlesex College Alumni Trustee Anvay Patel.

The Community, Innovation, and Opportunity (CIO) Strategic Investment Plan will drastically transform the outdoor activities available to families and individuals across both Middlesex County and the State of New Jersey."

Murphy. Together, these improvements will further solidify Middlesex College as a crucial anchor in a community that will continue to grow and flourish for generations to come."

Indian-American Doctor Awarded Humanitarian Award for Covid-Relief Work in India

ndian-American doctor Avinash Gupta was conferred with the humanitarian award by Monmouth Medical Center-Southern Campus for his exemplary work in public health and social service, especially for the Covid-19 related relief work in India and the US.

Dr. Avinash Gupta, Chief of Cardiology and President-elect of the medical staff at Monmouth Medical Center Southern Campus (MMCSC) in New Jersey USA, launched teleconsultation service that provided relief to the poor during the deadly second wave of Covid-19 in 2021 in India.

He and his wife, Dr Geeta Gupta, who hail from Ranchi, attended to over 1,000 patients, easing the pressure on overburdened hospitals. He raised over \$250,000 (over ₹ 2 crore) for medical relief in India and helped AASTHA, Patna-based NGO to establish a 10-bed Covid Care Center. He coordinated with other doctors to arrange medicines and send oxygen concentrators to India.

He virtually attended to many distraught Indians in the US, who didn't have medical insurance and couldn't visit a medical facility during the Covid-19 lockdown.

Dr. Avinash Gupta has been helping Indian students visiting the US for training, workshops, conferences, and internships. He and Dr. Geeta Gupta have been jointly helping such people not only at his place of stay, even providing free accommodation, food, etc., but also elsewhere in the USA, utilizing their wide and vast contacts and friendships, which they have in abundance.

In the US, Dr. Gupta led a team of 50 doctors and healthcare



professionals to vaccinate 3,500 Indian Americans in Ocean County in the state of New Jersey.

Under his presidency of MOCAAPI 2021 the organization donated \$150,000 to fulfill the food bank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties to help fight hunger in Ocean County.

He played a pivotal role in founding the Siddhivinayak Temple and Indian Cultural Center in Toms River in 2012, an organization for which he has personally donated hundreds of thousands of dollars, countless hours and sleepless nights.

After graduating from Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences in Ranchi, Dr. Gupta came to the United States in 1986 and went on to complete his Internal Medicine residency and Cardiology fellowship in New York.

Minimum Wage for Upstate New York Set to Increase from December 31

n areas outside New York City, Long Island and Westchester County, the minimum wage will rise from \$13.20 per hour to \$14.20, an increase of 7.5 per cent, according to the state Labor Department. In those other three areas of the state, the minimum

wage is already at \$15 an hour and will not increase further.

The new minimum covers all of Upstate New York, including the Syracuse area. It is set to take effect from December 31. The hike means an extra \$40 a week for someone working full time in a minimum wage job. Fast food workers were on a different schedule for raises. They already earn \$15 an hour everywhere in the state.

The new minimum still has to go through a formal rulemaking process before it's officially approved. That includes a public comment period.

Indian-American Food Delivery Agent Stabbed in New York

n Indian-American *Uber Eats* delivery person has been stabbed several times in an attack in the US by a career criminal with more than 100 arrests on his rap sheet, according to a media report.

Bharatbhai Patel was stabbed at the Lower East Side, New York on Tuesday, 27 September, by the ex-con described by police as a "super perp", *The New York Post* reported.


"Nobody helped," Patel told *The Post.* "He killed me here, here, here and here," he said, referring to the career-criminal suspect

and pointing to his wounds.

"He asked nothing. Not, 'I need money.' Nothing," the report added.

"Maybe they need money or something for my bike," he said. "But the guy asked me nothing." Patel said he saw around three people near him, during the 3 am attack, who did nothing to help -- leaving him to call 911 himself, the report added.

He speculated that the people may have been drunk.



NYC Mayor Adams Declares State of Emergency Over Migrant Crisis

ew York City Mayor Eric Adams declared a state of emergency on Friday, October 7, in response to the continued arrival of illegal migrants from southern states.

More than 17,000 migrants have been bused to the city since the spring, a small fraction of the migrant encounters at the border over that timeframe. *Fox News* cameras at the Port Authority transportation terminal filmed eight buses arriving on Friday, after nine arrived on Thursday.

Adams said that one in five people in the city's shelter system is a migrant, which is creating the "crisis."

"This is a humanitarian crisis that started with violence and

instability in South America and is being accelerated by American political dynamics," Adams said. "Thousands of asylum seekers have been bused into New York City and simply dropped off, without notice, coordination, or care — and more are arriving every day," Adams added.



NYC Will Pay for Foster Students' College Expenses

ew York City will cover the college tuition and housing costs for students in foster care, Mayor Eric Adams announced on October 4.

"A young person in foster care can attend the college of their choice without having to worry about the financial nightmare," said Jess Dannhauser, the commissioner of the Administration for Children's Services, which oversees the city's child welfare system.

"College choice will provide college students in foster care with the support they need to complete their college education successfully and attend the school of their choice, regardless of cost," said Mayor Adams. "This new program provides our young people in foster care help in covering up to \$15,000 in tuition costs each year not covered by financial aid, as well as room and board, and even provides a daily stipend for food or clothes. Growing up has never been more challenging, so we are holding up the torch to support our young people. No student's chances for success should depend on factors outside of their control. Now, our youth in foster care can attend a community college, a CUNY, a SUNY, an Ivy League, an HBCU, or any other school they dream of without worrying about how they pay for their education."

Jallosh (जल्लोष) meaning 'Celebrating with Community' is a Pathak (band) of like-minded Vadaks (instrumentalists) who have a penchant for playing Dhol-Tasha-Zanj-Lezim, a combination of Indian drum based percussion instruments. This tradition dates back to 16th century, when it was used as a war weapon and to boost soldier's morale in Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's Maratha empire (present day Maharashtra, India). Later in 1960s, it was introduced into civilian lifestyle by Dr. Appaji Pendse with a focus on developing personality, promoting team building, instilling discipline, realizing cultural values and to unite youth for social change, which then became a very common practice during Ganesh festival in modern days.

What started as a mere thought with a handful of friends coming together conceiving an idea and nurturing the seeds has allowed Jallosh to blossom into becoming a brand ambassador of Indian Roots that signify what enjoying true passion, cultivating rich heritage and giving back to the needy should be all about. Jallosh was formed in 2013 and is a registered non-profit under "Indian Roots, USA" as per IRC section 501(c)(3) with a troupe of 100+ members. Jallosh virtues of passion, purpose and charity are also being passed to the newer generations.

Lt. General Anil Chauhan (retd.) Appointed Next Chief of Defence Staff

The Indian Government on Wednesday, September 28, 2022, appointed former Eastern Army Commander Lt. General Anil Chauhan as the next Chief of Defence Staff (CDS).

The post has been vacant since the death of the country's first CDS Gen. Bipin Rawat in a helicopter crash in December 2021.

"The Government has decided to appoint Lt. Gen. Anil Chauhan (Retired) as the next Chief of Defence



Staff who shall also function as Secretary to Government of India, Department of Military Affairs with effect from the date of his assumption of charge and until further orders," the Defence Ministry said in a statement.

In a career spanning over nearly 40 years, Lt. Gen. Anil Chauhan had held several command, staff and instrumental appointments and had extensive experience in counterinsurgency operations in Jammu and Kashmir and North-East India, the statement said.

Born on May 18, 1961, Lt. Gen. Chauhan was commissioned into the 11 Gorkha Rifles of the Indian Army in 1981. He is an alumnus of the National Defence Academy, Khadakwasla and Indian Military Academy, Dehradun.

Diamond Tycoon Nirav Modi Warns of Suicide Risk from India Extradition

Nirav Modi, a former diamond tycoon accused of a \$2 billion loan fraud in India, urged a London court to block his extradition to his home country, claiming it could push him to suicide.

Modi suffers a "long-standing depressive condition" and sending him to a "hostile environment," where people burn his effigies could worsen his situation, his lawyer Edward Fitzgerald said in court. "He is even now at suicide risk and that suicide risk will be exacerbated if extradited."

He has contested his extradition order saying concerns over his mental health weren't properly considered. His lawyer also denied allegations of fraud.

The Indian authorities opposed those arguments, saying depression is curable and it can't be concluded that his mental health will only deteriorate, according to Helen Malcolm, a lawyer for the nation.

India has made assurances relating to prison conditions, health monitoring and proper treatment. "This is an extremely high-profile case in India and that means there will be many eyes on him," Malcolm said.

Man Held for Attacking Aged Hindu Women, to Face 63 Years Jail Term if Found Guilty

A 37-year-old man with a criminal record, named Lathan Johnson, reportedly attacked 14 older Hindu women in California and stole their necklaces during a two-month hate crime spree that began in June, according to authorities.

According to the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office, Johnson, a Palo Alto resident, targeted Hindu women, who turned out to be between ages 50 and 73.

Almost all the victims were wearing a sari, bindi, or other types of ethnic attire when they were attacked. The majority of the incidents, which began in June, occurred in San Jose, Milpitas, Sunnyvale and Santa Clara.

He was accused of forcefully removing jewellery from the necks of the women before making off in a getaway vehicle. In one such instance, he pushed a woman to the ground before punching her husband in the face, ripping off her necklace, and jumping inside a getaway car. In another such case, a woman's wrist was broken during the attack, the report added.

If convicted, Johnson will face a maximum jail term of 63 years. The next hearing in the case will take place on November 4. All of the stolen necklaces are estimated to be worth roughly \$35,000.

Over \$300,000 Raised for Indian-origin Sikh Family Killed in California

The grieving relatives of the four Indian-origin Sikhs killed in the US have raised more than \$300,000 to support their families in California but also their elderly parents back in India.

The Sikh family of four -- 8-month-old Aroohi Dheri, her 27-year-old mother Jasleen Kaur, her 36-year-old father Jasdeep Singh and her 39-year-old uncle Amandeep Singh -- were kidnapped and killed by a former employee of their trucking company last week.

A *GoFundMe* fundraiser is collecting funds for the Singh's extended family and has raised more than \$300,000, according to *abc7news.com*.

Jesus Manuel Salgado, a former employee at Jasdeep and Amandeep's trucking company, has been arrested and charged with murder and kidnapping. His brother Alberto Salgado was also arrested and charged with aiding him. *NBC News* could not identify a lawyer for either suspect.

FDA Authorizes Covid Omicron Booster Shots for Kids as Young as 5 Years Old

The Food and Drug Administration(FDA) on October 12 authorized Covid booster shots that target the omicron variant for pre-schoolers through elementary school students.

Pfizer's new omicron boosters are now authorized for children ages 5 to 11, and *Moderna's* shots for kids ages 6 through 17. The shots are administered two months following completion of the two-dose primary series or the most recent booster shot with the first-generation vaccines.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) still has to issue its recommendations before pharmacies can administer the new shots to kids. The CDC's advisory committee has meetings set for next week when independent vaccine experts will review the available data.

Pfizer's new boosters were cleared for people ages 12 and up in September, while *Moderna's* were authorized for adults ages 18 and older.



Dr. Murthy: Representative on WHO Executive Board

Indian origin surgeon Dr. Vivek Murthy, 45, will serve in the new position alongside his continued duties as the **US Surgeon General.**

"While serving as the 21st Surgeon General, Dr Murthy is focused on drawing attention to and working across government to address a number of critical public health issues, including the growing proliferation of health misinformation, the ongoing youth mental health crisis, well-being and burnout in the health worker community, and social isolation and loneliness," said the White House.

Elon Musk Ropes in Indian-**Origin Technology Executive to Revamp Twitter**

Sriram Krishnan, an Indianorigin technology executive, is "helping out" Twitter's new owner Elon Musk as he revamps the social media giant following its acquisition by the billionaire entrepreneur.

Krishnan is a general partner at Silicon Valley venture capital firm Andreessen Horowitz (a16z).

"Now that the word is out: I'm helping out @elonmusk with Twitter temporarily with some other great people. I (and a16z) believe this is a hugely important company and can have a great impact on the world and Elon is the person to make it happen," Krishnan tweeted.

Krishnan added that he is "still very much in my day job" at @ a16zcrypto. "If you're a crypto founder, you know how to find me!"

It's always a terrific feeling to watch a film with all the ingredients of a masala blockbuster, aka adrenaline pumping BGM, claptrap dialogues, full on action and guns blazing.

Though I am not too glad about the remake spree that Bollywood seems to be on but that opinion had been conveniently set aside in the excitement to see two of my favourite actors onscreen. Hrithik Roshan and Saif Ali Khan can be single handedly my reason for watching a film. Imagine the excitement to see them together.

The film starts on a bombarding note with Saif in total swag.

Love the way Saif wears his characters, confident and totally at ease, whether it is a goofy one like in *Go Goa Gone/ Kaala Kaandi* or intense ones like *Bullet Raja, Bazaar* or *Laal Kaptaan*. As a crime branch cop here, he is totally in his elements. I also admire the way he chooses to style his physique. Not in the race for 6 or 8 packs but fit and beefed up. He looks superb.

Our hearts had to wait a while to get to see Hrithik, but it was worth the wait. When he enters, it's worth whistles and claps, with full on swag.

And we realise that the moment he joins the story, it gets exhilarating. His encounters and scenes with Saif are the highlights of the film. He provides what could be called as the food for soul to the masala genre lovers, the BGM booming and adrenaline pumping scenes.

It was a pleasure to see them clashing, dialogue for dialogue and blow for blow. The narrative style brings intrigue that grips you till the end. Radhika Apte, Sharib Hashmi, Rohit Saraf and Satyadeep Mishra add good support.

While nothing could ever dampen my love for these two stars whose standing, charm and charisma go beyond any box office numbers or validation, I feel the film, minus these two brightening star elements, did have some aspects that dampened my over-all feeling for the film.

The screenplay had a lot of scope for improvement.

The backstories, which were very crucial to the main story, surprisingly seemed to pull down the film every time. Vikram's backstory seemed too rushed and stuffed up. Vedha's backstories seemed to drag and were too cliche.

The side characters were not able to create much impact. And a special word for Vikram's team. They seemed so clueless; he might as well have borrowed Singham's team; at least they would have brought in some humor.

The dialects were not too precise, but I was thankful that they didn't go all over the place like in some other films by renowned filmmakers from the south.

The overall length could have been shortened, and that might have helped the pace too. Having been blown away by Pushkar Gayatri's Suzhal Vortex, I had higher expectations from the duo. But that's just my perspective.

Having said that, there is no denying the fact that the film was totally paisa vasool. Saif and Hrithik, along with the invigorating moments, intrigue, action, and dialogues, make it worth your while.

The corporate is eyeing a rare mineral, the govt is aiming for the development of the area and the locals are bent on protecting the mines that holds captive an evil spirit.

It's a complex play of greed, fear, faith, science and beliefs that is further complicated by bewildering happenings and a dark past.

Someone has to solve the puzzle before it's too late.

Analysis

Horror is a rare genre as far as Hindi series go, and when you get it along with a good cast, it was bound to get me excited. The trailer looked kickass and intriguing.

The biggest plus point is that the story uses folklore myths and superstitious beliefs, which sets it apart from the typical paranormal stuff. While there's a constant fear factor, it gets superseded by curiosity about the truth behind the inexplicable developments.

The rural setting and the occult practices shown lend an earthy authentic touch. There is a constant intrigue factor that has been maintained throughout the series. The mystery is intense even though you would partly decipher it and make your guesses. The atmospherics work very well because of the locations used. The story doesn't give in to horror tropes or jump scares even though they had the opportunity.

But there are so many aspects that could have been better. The special effects and the studio scenes seemed bad. Logic was really thrown out of the window in many places. Most of the cave scenes were so bad visually and logic-wise that they seemed laughable.

For the visual deficits, I can understand the budget constraints, but it would have required just a little more effort to take care of the screenplay loopholes. It also conveniently leaves some unanswered questions.

The cast and their performances contribute a lot to the overall feel of the series. Any lesser actors or performances and this would have ended up looking like B grade stuff.

A special word for the star of the series (in every way)

Tisca delivers well, one of the meatiest roles that I have seen her in. She plays the various shades to her character with aplomb and I could easily say that her performance is pivotal in bringing the story to shine.

While I am a fan of and quite liked the presence of Saurabh Shukla and Rajesh Tailang, it was actually some other actors that impressed me.

Would look forward to see more of Pankaj Sharma (Sachet Singh) and Rohan Joshi (Anay)

The series is far from perfect but keeping in mind that it is impossible to get it totally right in this genre, I would say that it is a very good attempt.

It is a good watch for the horror / thriller lovers.












Rob Wade to Replace Charlie Collier as Fox Entertainment CEO

Veteran Reporter Nikki Finke, 68, Dies

Finke died on October 9 in Boca Raton, Florida, after a prolonged illness, according to *Deadline*.

A famously reclusive blogger, Finke began writing LA Weekly's "Deadline Hollywood" column in 2002 and made it essential reading for gossip and trade news. Four years later, she launched Deadline Hollywood Daily as a website.

Blogging at *Deadline.com*, Finke made a pugnacious media empire of scoops and gossip, renowned for her "live-snarking" award shows and story updates that blared "TOLDJA!" when one of her earlier exclusives proved accurate.



Alec Baldwin Settles Lawsuit with Family of Cinematographer Killed on 'Rust' Set

lec Baldwin settled a lawsuit filed by loved ones of cinematographer Halyna Hutchins, who was killed on the set of his movie "Rust" last year.

Hutchins, 42, was fatally shot and director Joel Souza, then 48, was wounded in the incident October 21, 2021 in New Mexico when a live round was discharged from a gun held by Baldwin, who shares screen and producer credits on the suspended movie.

Hutchins' family sued in February accusing Baldwin and others involved in the film of reckless behaviour and costcutting measures that led to the tragedy nearly one year ago at Bonanza Creek Ranch, in Santa Fe County.

"Throughout this difficult process, everyone has maintained the specific desire to do what is best for Halyna's son," Baldwin's attorney Luke Nikas said in a statement. "We are grateful to everyone who contributed to the resolution of this tragic and painful situation."
