HATE CRIME-EXTREMISTS TARGET INDIAN-AMERICAN COMMUNITY TWICE IN THREE WEEKS

Global Icon of Peace and Non-violence Mahatma Gandhi's statue violently vandalized

n what is definitely being perceived as a hate crime, a group of six unidentified people destroyed a handcrafted statue of Mahatma Gandhi with a sledgehammer at a Hindu temple in New York after vandalizing it earlier in the month of August.

Indian authorities strongly condemned the "despicable action" and took up the matter with the US authorities to ensure those responsible for the act are held accountable.

The New York City Police Department(NYPD) in a statement to *PTI* said it was reported to police on August 16 that "a group of six unidentified male individuals" damaged and vandalized "a religious statue with a sledge hammer in front of *Tulsi Mandir* located at 103-26 111 Street". Video surveillance shows that a sledgehammer was used and 6 people can be seen stomping on the statue once it was thrown to the ground.

"The male individuals then fled toward Liberty Avenue and entered two vehicles, a white Mercedes Benz and a dark colour possibly a Toyota Camry with possible taxi/livery sticker on the back passenger window," it said, adding that the miscreants were approximately aged between 25 to 30 years.

The NYPD has asked for the public's assistance in ascertaining the whereabouts of the miscreants and urged anyone with information related to the incident to call its Crime Stoppers Hotline or submit their tips at Crime Stoppers website.

York New State Assemblywoman **Jenifer** Rajkumar in a statement said, "In an act outraging the entire Queens community and peaceloving people worldwide, the statue of Mahatma Gandhi outside Shri Tulsi Mandir was vandalised for a second time." "This time, the statue was totally destroyed and graffitied with obscene names. Vandals also graffitied the mandir grounds and 111th Street asphalt," the Indian-American lawmaker said.

"To see them coming after us like this is very painful," Lakhram Maharaj, the founder of *Shri Tulsi Mandir* situated in South Richmond Hill, was quoted as saying in the report. Maharaj discovered the Gandhi statue was reduced to rubble. The words "dog" and "Gandhi dog" were spray painted both in front of the temple and down the block. Maharaj says many in the community are now afraid to go to the temple.

Condemning the "cowardly act", Ankur Vaidya, Chairman of the diaspora organization Federation of Indian Associations (FIA), said, "We sincerely urge the mayor's office and the NYPD

have the will and intention to do more malice to create negative sensationalism." The incident is an act of hate and aggression and has repeated itself more times this year than in the history of the city previously, he said. In February, an 8-foot-high Gandhi statue, located in Manhattan's Union Square, was defaced by unknown people.

FIA President Mr. Kenny Desai said that along with the Indian American community, we at the Federation of Indian Associations condemn these extremist and cowardly act of violently vandalizing the statue of a global peace and non-violence icon Mahatma Gandhi. We urge the community to unite in registering a peaceful protest and appeal to the authorities to take due action.

Meanwhile, the Consulate General of India in New York, in a statement, said it "strongly condemns the vandalization of the Mahatma Gandhi statue outside a temple in Queens, New York. We have taken up the matter with US authorities, seeking a thorough investigation so that those responsible for such despicable action are held accountable."

Mr. Prem Bhandari, Chairman of Jaipur Foot USA, condemned the dastardly act and said that it was nothing short of a sacrilege and called upon the authorities to address the rising incidents which clearly target a peaceloving community.

FIA sponsors, in particular, State Bank of India, Amneal, and Bombino Express, stepped up and made the event possible even when supply chains impacted budget fluctuation inflation.

FIA Chairman Ankur Vaidya, who conceptualized the GWR plan and compiled the team which included GWR Parveen Bansal along with Amit Ringasia, Rohit Korat, Sidharth Murali, Amar Chavda, Mahesh Dubal and Dipak Goel.

President Kenny Desai led the Executive team's efforts that support the entire GWR team and efforts including fundraising, seeking involvement of multiple organizations and monitoring the overall logistics. Anil Bansal - two term FIA President (2020 and 2021) provided complimentary logistical support with 6000 sf of office/storage space to accommodate the large four truck loads cargo that was required to achieve GWR.

Parveen Bansal assembled a team of dedicated volunteers from FIA, BAPS, Vraj Temple, Bjana, State Bank of India, and the Brahma Kumaris who methodically implemented. rehearsed, and coordinated all the on-ground efforts to set these two records.



Raja Krishnamoorthi Urges to Prosecute Woman who Harassed Indian-Americans

ongressman Raja
Krishnamoorthi has
urged the Dallas police
to prosecute to the full
extent of law a woman
seen harassing and assaulting
four Indian descent women in
Texas last week.

"Such bigoted attacks motivated by racism, xenophobia, and other forms of hate victimise not only those directly targeted by them, but also broader communities through creating an atmosphere of fear and danger," Mr. Krishnamoorthi said.

Esmeralda Upton from Plano in Texas was arrested for the racially-motivated physical and verbal assault of the four women at a parking lot. The video has been going viral on social media and has shocked the Indian American community across

the country. Upton identifies herself in the video as a Mexican-American.

"I hate you Indian. All these Indians come to America because they want a better life," she is seen saying in the video. "You... people are ruining this country," she says in the video

FIA Chairman Mr. Ankur Vaidya said that such deplorable acts should be strongly condemned and the community must get united to address the rising wave of such crimes.

FIA President, Mr. Kenny Desai, denounced the attacks and stated that exemplary action needs to be taken by the authorities as the hate crimes and racist attacks against an essentially peaceloving community have been on the rise.

Over 130 Indian-Americans at Key Posts in Joe Biden Administration

ore than 130 Indian-Americans have been appointed by US President Joe Biden to important positions in his administration so far, providing the community — which makes up around 1 per cent of the country's population — with the best representation.

In doing so he has not only fulfilled his promise to the community that he had made as a presidential candidate in 2020, but also shattered the record of his predecessor Donald Trump, who had appointed more than 80 Indian-Americans, and his previous boss Barack Obama, who had appointed over 60 Indian-Americans to key positions during his eight years

of presidency.

More than 40 Indian-Americans have been elected at various state and federal levels, including four in the US House of Representatives. Not to miss the more than 20 Indian-Americans leading top US companies.

"Indian-Americans have been imbued with the sense of *seva* (service) and this is reflected in their enthusiasm to pursue positions in public service instead of the private sector," Silicon Valley-based entrepreneur, philanthropist and venture capitalist Mr. Rangaswami told *Press Trust of India*.

"The Biden administration has now appointed or nominated the largest group to date and, needless to say, we are proud of our people and their accomplishments for the United States," Rangaswami said. Rangaswami is founder and head of *Indiaspora*, a US-based global organization for Indianorigin leaders. *Indiaspora* keeps a track of Indian-origin leaders.



IndianAmerican VP at Twitter Quits to Join Meta

enior Indian American *Twitter* executive Mr. Sandeep Pandey, is leaving *Twitter* after more than a decade to join *Meta*.

According to an Insider report, Pandey, who joined *Twitter* in 2012, will work on *Meta's* artificial intelligence and machine learning teams.

Twitter has been seeing several high-profile exits after Tesla CEO Elon Musk announced a \$44 billion takeover, and then terminated it over the actual number of bots on the platform.

These are Katrina Lane, former VP of Twitter service; Ilya Brown, VP of Health; and Max Schmeiser, head of data science.

Mr. Parag Agrawal in May fired Consumer Product Leader Kayvon Beykpour and Head of Revenue Product Bruce Falck, saying there is a hiring freeze now and *Twitter* will also pause spending in most areas.

Twitter recently laid off 30 per cent of employees from its talent acquisition team. Twitter paused most hiring and backfilled, except for business-critical roles.



Student Debt Relief by President Biden's Administration

resident Biden announced a plan to erase thousands of dollars in student loans for borrowers, aiming to help more than 40 million Americans who owe a combined \$1.7 trillion in debt.

"The administration's actions will help ensure that pursuing a degree isn't a one-way ticket into poverty," Century Foundation president Mark Zuckerman and

director of higher education Robert Shireman said in an emailed statement.

The Biden administration said that it will cancel up to \$20,000 for people who received Pell Grants, which are available to low-income undergraduate students who have exceptional financial need.

The administration said that borrowers who didn't receive Pell Grants will get up to \$10,000 in forgiveness.

The chief criterion for eligibility is a person's income, as the Biden administration said it is limiting debt for giveness to people who earn less than \$125,000. Married couples can earn up to \$250,000 and still qualify for the program.

The Department of Education is working on what the White House describes as "a simple application process for borrowers to claim relief."



Mayor Eric Adams Vows to Clean up NYC's Outdoor-Dining Scene

As long as I have something to say about it, this initiative will be here, but we're going to get it right," NY Mayor Eric Adams said at a Thursday August 18, 2022, press conference, in front of an abandoned dining shed in Manhattan. He called on the city's residents to report any unused or unsafe outdoor dining sheds, because they "can't be a safe haven for rats" or illegal behavior.

The city has dismantled at least two dozen sheds, as part of its new enforcement initiative, and is targeting at least 37 others with "egregious violations" for hygiene or safety, according to a press release.

Restaurants The Open program has been a lifeline for New York's restaurants throughout pandemic, the providing customers with alternatives to eating inside and sometimes increasing a restaurant's footprint. City Council is envisioning a permanent program that would expand sidewalk dining and allow businesses that previously

participated to reapply for permits. More than 12,000 restaurants offer outdoor dining, according to city data.

But, while a boon for restaurants, some residents have complained about trash, vermin, noise and fewer parking spaces as a result of the program.

"Unfortunately, there's a minority who don't like outdoor dining at all," Adams said. "Their lawsuit against the city is slowing the process of making the program permanent. I want to say very clearly: "As much as I can have a hand in it, outdoor dining is here to stay."

Asthana oversees the largest power grid in North America and one of the largest electricity markets in the world as the CEO and president of PJM.



INDIA IN TRANSITION

Rain, rivers, coasts and seas have shaped our societies from the earliest days. Tales from classical antiquity to the Abrahamic religions to ancient Mesopotamia speak of how water changed the course of history. In India, the "crucible of the monsoon," the annual drama of the moisturecarrying winds that bring 80 per cent of the country's rainfall between June and September, has long shaped everything from childhood to culture to commerce. Some of the first written accounts of managing rainfall variability date back to Kautilya's ancient treatise Arthashatra, written in the 4th century BCE, which discussed ways to predict and adapt to monsoon rains. While rainfall variability is not a new phenomenon, what is new is the intensity of change as a consequence of climate change.

It is often said that if climate change is the shark, then water is its teeth. Climate change is felt most deeply through water, with higher temperatures leading to droughts, floods and increasing rainfall variability. Every increase in the degree of global warming is likely to intensify water-related risks. As concerns about what a hotter climate will bring grow, this important issue of too much water and

too little water continues to occupy center stage in policy discussions. And even as uncertainties about the future fate of the monsoons remain and science evolves with new generations of climate models, scientists agree that changes in monsoon variability are underway and will continue.

India is already witnessing a collision of long dry spells interspersed with short spells of rainy days, sometimes within a span of a month. In June of this year, while Assam was reeling from drought, it was stricken by intense rainfall that unleashed devastating floods within a week. With climate change, the latest report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) warns that the likelihood of such overlapping compounding risks will only become more frequent.

The increasing variability of water too much or too little — can weigh heavily on communities and represents one of the most significant sources of risk facing Indian farms, firms, and families. Too much water in the form of deluges and rising waters are high-impact events that can destroy critical infrastructure, damage homes, and disrupt livelihoods for the millions of people living at water's edge. New data suggests 390 million Indians, or about three out of every ten people, live in areas directly exposed to 1-in-100 year floods. These floods can produce at least half a foot of water — an extreme inundation capable of causing severe damage. But not everyone is affected equally. A staggering 65 million people living in extreme poverty (i.e., on less than \$1.90 per day) with limited capacity to cope, recover, or move face high flood risk. The impact of floods on the lives, livelihoods, and well-being of the extremely poor is, therefore, the worst. While floods are catastrophic events, spatially diffused and slower-moving droughts are like misery in slow motion that can hamper firm and city productivity, accelerate the destruction of forests, and compromise people's health and agricultural systems.

Adapting to such rainfall variability

is often much more challenging than accommodating long-term trends because of the unpredictable duration and the uncertain magnitude. Not surprisingly, a majority of countries have listed water as the priority for adaptation in their climate change plans. The latest IPCC report also finds that the majority of these climate change adaptation strategies target the agriculture sector, which accounts for 80 to 90 per cent of global water consumption. One of the most ubiquitous adaptation strategies is irrigation, the strategic storage and application of water on crops. These efforts can play a crucial buffer role in shielding crops from some of the hardships and uncertainties arising from the increased variability of rainfall and increased heat. The clearest example of this in India is groundwater irrigation, which has surpassed surface irrigation and grown by an explosive 500 per cent over the past 55 years, making it one of the largest groundwater guzzlers in the world. The benefits to farms have been enormous. But to what extent and for how long?

Empirical and statistical analyses can shed light on the aggregate impacts. My co-authored research developed an econometric model of weather and irrigation effects to evaluate the impact of past irrigation trends on yields using forty years of data. We examined this for the case of water-intensive wheat, which is estimated to be the country's single main driver of increased consumptive irrigation demand. Indian wheat contributes 13 per cent of the global wheat supply and half of all domestic calories obtained from cereals. Results show that the rise in irrigation has been pivotal in wheat's rise as a major crop in India. Irrigation has moderated drought impacts and alleviated yield sensitivity to heat such that in the absence of irrigation over the past four decades, national vields would have been 13 per cent lower. However, it is questionable whether this benefit will continue in the future. In recent years, yield gains from irrigation expansion

have slowed down while negative impacts of rising temperature and drought have continued to accrue, suggesting that strategies that have worked in the past may not work in the future. One of the reasons for this trend reversal is that the past's benefits have come at the cost of increased pressure on groundwater sources. Increased use of groundwater irrigation has led to widespread over-extraction of groundwater and drops in groundwater levels. When groundwater levels become deeper, rising pumping costs and costly well deepening can make extraction prohibitive. As reliance on groundwater grows, even as access to groundwater supplies dwindle, the impacts of drought and heat on water users in the future could be greater than today.

Groundwater depletion may reduce cropping intensity by up to 20 per cent across all of India, and by mid-century, when the impacts of climate change will be more pronounced, a loss in access to groundwater could reduce annual crop production by up to 28 per cent and dry season crop production by up to 51 per cent, compromising food security, farmer livelihoods, and welfare. Declining groundwater levels also means drying up of rivers in the dry season when water is most critically needed because the baseflows from aquifers feed perennial rivers. Paradoxically, the resource that has cushioned climatic variability in the past can also create the conditions that magnify and accentuate their adverse impacts in the future.

The reasons for this would have been familiar to Jean Baptiste Say, the 1900-century French economist who popularized the proposition that "supply creates its own demand." In this case, it implies that water made available cheaply will be used freely. In some arid areas, the supply of free or underpriced irrigation water creates an illusion of abundance. which increases the cultivation of waterintensive crops — such as rice, wheat, sugarcane, and cotton — that are ultimately unsuited to these regions. As a result, crop productivity suffers disproportionately in times of increases in temperature and rainfall variability due to extraordinary water needs that cannot be met, upsetting an already tenuous resource balance. This, in turn, fuels vulnerability to drought and

Waterinvestments can also in advertently exacerbate inequities. In Maharashtra, the scale and pace of plastic-lined farm pond development in drought-prone areas has increased rapidly since 2015. While the intent was to drought-proof smallholder agriculture by promoting rainwater harvesting, primary research shows that

farmers were incentivized to extract groundwater and fill the ponds to support the intensification or expansion of highervalue, water-intensive crops. This, in turn, drove more groundwater extraction and increased competition amongst farmers. Moreover, many ponds lose water to evaporation due to high temperatures. About 81,247 cubic meters (about the volume of 32.5 Olympic-sized swimming pools) of water can evaporate in a single month, undermining other water needs for agriculture, drinking and domestic uses. Since richer farmers own farm ponds, these unintended effects directly hit the poor and marginal farmers by undercutting their access to groundwater, exacerbating overall water scarcity.

These responses are often magnified by incentives created by a complex web of subsidies. Both input and output subsidies — guaranteed procurement at set prices that feeds the country's Public Distribution System — influence cropping and investment decisions in agriculture. Subsidies for electricity — the key input used for groundwater extraction amount to 85 per cent of the average cost of supply and play a critical role in enabling groundwater extraction. Free or flatly tariffed electricity provision has led to an increase in the value of irrigation-intensive crops and, hence, the area on which these crops are grown. Output subsidies such as minimum support prices(MSP) for rice and wheat can skew cropping decisions in favor of these crops, even in areas not conducive for their growth.

The prudent strategy is to encourage the production of crops more closely aligned with local agroecology rather than subsidizing crops that enhance vulnerability to climatic shocks. Moreover, investing in complementary solutions to buffer communities — for example, protecting watersheds and forests and using environmentally-sensitive land management practices — can increase water flows and produce greater benefits to crop productivity and incomes than investing in any single one of these solutions.

Change is often difficult. However, over time, well-intentioned investments that provide short-term relief can generate costly lock-in effects, and path dependence can set in, which renders corrective actions more difficult and costly. Confronted with intensifying levels of variability, greater policy attention needs to be given to examining the effectiveness of remedies with a long-term view. So far, solutions have remained piecemeal, in part because conventional approaches pay insufficient attention to the water cycle and the multiple attributes of water at each stage in its cycle of use — from its source in the watersheds to its eventual users across

farms, firms, cities and households; and its re-entry back to the source.

Successfully managing water requires aligning policy and practice that recognizes water's value throughout this entire chain of use while balancing three competing priorities: efficiency, equity and sustainability. But as with any chain, it is only as strong as its weakest link. And herein lies the challenge that plagues current water management practices. Different sectors and users consider their narrow constituencies and neglect the effects on the whole system. The new National Water Policy drafted by a committee of independent experts set up by the Ministry of Jal Shakti recognizes these gaps and offers a paradigm shift for managing and governing water resources. It provides a roadmap for developing solutions to safeguard water resources sustainably and to use water wisely and equitably in a way that eschews a "command-and-control" approach to one that recognizes the immense diversity of India when planning for water.

This is all the more important with climate change, which brings even greater uncertainty about the future. Such circumstances put a high premium on adaptable and flexible solutions that respond to new information and changing circumstances. In doing so, it will be critical for local and national governments, civil society, and water users from all sectors and backgrounds to engage in a sustained dialogue to identify priorities for water allocation and the processes that will build a consensus. We need to redouble our efforts for a sustainable water future for India. Every single drop of effort matters.

Liz Truss Appointed as Britain's PM

Liz Truss took over as British prime minister on Tuesday 6th September.

Truss, the fourth Conservative prime minister in six years, flew to the royal family's Scottish home to be asked by Queen Elizabeth to form a government. She replaces Boris Johnson, who was forced out after three tumultuous years in power.

The symbolic ceremony took place at the sovereign's remote Balmoral retreat in the Scottish Highlands, as the queen was deemed unfit to return to London due to ill health.

"Ms Truss accepted Her Majesty's offer and kissed hands upon her appointment as Prime Minister and First Lord of the Treasury," Buckingham Palace said.

Her plan to revive growth through tax cuts while also potentially providing around 100 billion pounds (\$116 billion) for energy has rattled financial markets, prompting investors to dump the pound and government bonds in recent weeks.



FDA Authorizes New COVID-19 **Boosters Ahead of Fall Booster** Campaign

New and updated COVID-19 booster shots were given emergency use authorization by the Food and Drug Administration on Wednesday 31st August 2022, paving the way for shots in arms as soon as next week.

The booster shots were updated to target two different COVID strains in one shot -- the current omicron sub variants, BA.4 and BA.5, which make up 99 per cent of new cases in the US, and the original strain of COVID-19.

This is the first time current COVID-19 vaccines have had a major upgrade. In the future, experts expect the vaccines could be updated periodically to match current strains -- akin to the way the flu shot is slightly different each year.

Ex-NYPD Cop who Assaulted DC Officer on January 6 Gets Record-setting 10-year Sentence

A retired New York City Police Department officer who was convicted of several felonies for attacking a D.C. cop with a flag pole on Jan. 6 and then tackling the officer to the ground and attempting to rip off his gas mask was sentenced to 10 years in federal prison on Thursday 1st September.

Thomas Webster was sentenced by US District Judge Amit P. Mehta to the longest sentence yet in a case related to the riot at the US Capitol on January 6, 2021.

Webster, 56, was convicted by a jury in May

after they determined he was lying on the stand when he tried to convince them he was trying to help the officer he assaulted to "see my hands" when he grabbed the officer's gas mask after he tackled him to the ground.





Narasimhan most recently served as CEO of health and hygiene company Reckitt, which owns brands such as Lysol, Durex and Mucinex. He announced earlier on Thursday, September 2nd, that he was stepping down from that role. He'll join Starbucks in October, learning about the company and its reinvention plan, before assuming the top job in April.

Until then, Howard Schultz will continue as interim CEO of the coffee chain he grew into a global giant. Schultz will remain on Starbucks' board after Narasimhan succeeds him.

Narasimhan previously worked at PepsiCo, serving as its global chief commercial officer, among other roles. Prior to working at the food and beverage giant, he was a senior partner at McKinsey.



India's First Homegrown Aircraft Carrier Puts it Among World's Naval Elites

India joined an elite league of the world's naval powers, when it commissioned its first domestically built aircraft carrier, the INS Vikrant.

With the \$3 billion Vikrant, India will join only a small number of nations with more than one aircraft carrier or helicopter carrier in service and become only the third country, after the UK and China, to have commissioned a domestically built aircraft carrier in the past three years.

The carrier has filled the nation with "new confidence," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said at a ceremony marked by fanfare at the Cochin Shipyard in India's southern Kerala state.



Portugal Health Minister Resigns Following Pregnant Indian Tourist's Death

Portugal's Health Minister Marta Temido resigned on Tuesday after the widespread criticism of her decision to temporarily close emergency obstetric services and forcibly transfer an Indian pregnant woman between hospitals.

Temido in a sentence said that she "no longer has the conditions" to exercise the position, which the prime minister accepted.

Her resignation was announced five hours after the news of the death of a pregnant Indian woman in Lisbon who was being transferred from Hospital de Santa Maria to Hospital Sao Francisco Xavier, due to a lack of vacancies in the neonatology service.

During the trip, there was a cardiorespiratory arrest, and resuscitation work was carried out on the transport, reported RTP News.

According to Centro Hospitalar Universitario Lisboa Norte (CHULN), at the Sao Francisco Xavier Hospital, the pregnant woman was "submitted to an urgent cesarean section, with the newborn, weighing 722 grams, going to the neonatal intensive care unit for prematurity".

mother was hospitalized in intensive care, and died ', indicated the CHULN, sending "the deepest condolences to the family".



India Now World's Fifth Largest Economy, Overtakes UK

Britain has dropped behind India to become the world's sixth largest economy, delivering a further blow to the government in London as it grapples with a brutal cost-of-living shock.

India leaped past the UK in the final three months of 2021 to become the fifth-biggest economy. The calculation is based in US dollars, and India extended its lead in the first quarter, according to GDP figures from the International Monetary Fund.

The UK's decline down the international rankings is an unwelcome backdrop for the new prime minister. Conservative Party members chose Boris Johnson's, with Foreign Secretary Liz Truss expected to beat former Chancellor of the Exchequer Rishi Sunak in the run-off.



Cyrus Mistry, Tata Sons Ex Chairman, Dies In Accident

Cyrus Mistry, scion of one of India's most illustrious business families and who also formerly headed the nation's biggest business group- TATA, died in a road accident near Mumbai. He was 54.

The car, which Mistry was in, hit a divider on a bridge in Palghar at about 2:30 pm on Sunday, September 4. Local police confirmed this. Mistry and another passenger were killed, and two others were injured and taken to the hospital.

The news is the latest blow for the Mistry family, whose patriarch, Pallonji Mistry — Cyrus's father — died in June at the age of 93. Their Shapoorji Pallonji Group was founded in 1865 and built luxury hotels, stadiums, palaces, and factories across Asia, including the tower wing of the iconic Taj Mahal hotel in Mumbai. But the Mistry's were most recently known for a feud with the Tata Group.


Janmashtami Celebrations Held at Radha Gopal Temple in Edison in New Jersey

Dr. Tushar Patel, Indian Health Camp of New Jersey and Ritesh Shah, Pharmacist/Founder of Ritesh Shah Charitable







Bilkis Bano Case

The release of the accused in the famous Bilkis Bano case in India has stirred up the hornet's nest. Some have opposed the release of the 11 accused who were serving life sentences, while some, on the other hand, say that the law took its proper course and the release happened after the men spent 14 years in jail.

According to those who favor the judgement, legal consequences depend upon what punishment is pre-defined in that particular act under which the accused has been charged rather than on an emotional demand or outburst of a group. The court of law acts as per the prescribed statute & has to follow the well laid down legal procedures before it can convict anyone.

This is how a democratic country functions under the constitution & law of the land. At the end of the day charges levied under any specific legal act on the accused have to have merit in

order to be tested under the law by the petitioner (i.e., Govt) in a legal setup.

I agree that judgments should not be meted out based on emotional outbursts - Taliban style yet my argument is that even though the Law has a provision for release after 14 years, it's not a mandate that they have to be released. It is the court's discretion based on the gravity of the crimes, the behaviour of the accused during the jail term, and the risks of early release. If you believe that raping a 6-month pregnant woman, smashing the skull of her 3-yearold daughter, raping and killing her mother and sister and then killing 11 members of the family isn't a heinous crime - then that's worrisome.

"I want you to close your eyes and take a moment to imagine this. I want you to picture a 21-year-old Hindu girl called Radha fleeing the communal riots in her village along with her family. There are 16 in this group, including 4 children and 4 women, and they all fear for their lives. They hide in a truck to transport themselves to a safer spot away from the bloodlust around them. The truck doesn't make it far as a Muslim mob surrounds it. Armed with rods and swords, this mob starts killing everyone in the truck one by one. The women are last to die, not because of chivalry but because they have to be raped first. The older women are raped and disposed of. Everyone is beheaded so that their bodies can't be identified. But I have never been more glad to surpass my own expectations. And my heart proved to my pragmatic self that it's difficult for an Aamir film to disappoint me and not move me to tears.


Laal Singh Chaddha is as simple a storytelling as its protagonist Laal, with a heart of gold and nothing but good intentions and love.

He is extremely intelligent as a filmmaker. He diverts so much of our emotional energy that we can't help but overlook his repetitiveness. I admire him for that too. But one grouse, he drives my tear glands bonkers.

I have always found time zones, parallel worlds and space-time concepts complicated. Never liked them much in action flicks and pure sci-fi genres.

But the concept intrigues me when not too complicated or when accompanied by a mystery or thrill or slight drama involved.

And that is why *Dobaaraa* clicked perfectly for me. It is a great blend of mystery and space-time continuum. It begins with what looks like murder mystery and soon

transforms into something much more complicated. You are continually trying to run ahead of the screenplay trying to guess what to expect. But this one is not going to be that easy for the Sherlock in you. There are not just the characters at play but parallel timelines that continually try to derail your guessing skills. The mystery is relentless and delicious.

Joining the dots is going to as difficult for you as it were for Antara and Anay. At some unanswered questions. But when the story proceeds, you get so entwined in its loop, so involved in your protagonists' lives, so desperate to find a closure for them, you would overlook it.

The film remains so engrossing throughout, that even at points where you are not wowed, it has your rapt attention. The holes fade out in the story's own warp and weft just like in an optical illusion; something successfully takes

a doting mother desperate to get back her life and child. The emotional hold Antara had over me is all credit to her.

Loved Rahul Bhat. There is always something very appealing and honest about his performances, whether in Ugly or Section 375 or this one. He adds heft irrespective of the length of his role.

Pavail Gulati holds the fort. Though his character didn't enjoy the arch and depth of his role in *Thappad*, where I found him fantastic, I liked him here. I will look forward to more of his meatier roles.



Set years earlier in the same universe of George RR Martin's book, "House of the Dragon" depicts the glory days of the ancestors of popular "Thrones"


characters, such as Daenerys Targaryen. It is based on his book, "Fire and Blood."


